The Responsorial Psalm continues the tree imagery found in the First Reading. The just will be like the palm tree (large, visible from a distance, fruitful, etc.) and like the cedar of Lebanon (a common Old Testament symbol of strength and beauty).

This is a wisdom psalm that calls us to choose a righteous path. We have to choose to live in God's ways and reject anything that might distract us from our true goal.

We must praise and thank God, placing him at the center of our lives and our love.
