THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and, where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Acts 1:1-11

2nd Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

Gospel: Luke 24:46-53

Reflection before the Gospel: "Go and teach all nations, says the Lord; I am with you always, until the end of the world." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 47:2-3, 6-9

This psalm proclaims God as the king of the heavens and the earth. There are no nations upon the earth that are not part of His reign. Nothing can escape God's control.

The first section speaks of God the Most High. The Hebrew phrase that we translate as "most High" is "el Elyon." Originally, this title meant God of the heights (for there was a shrine to Yahweh upon every hilltop).

It eventually came to mean that God was beyond our understanding.

One must ask what it means for God to be our king. This seems to be an archaic title, especially in those countries that do not have a tradition of a monarchy.

But even in our country we can easily understand that it means that God is to be the center of our lives, the source and the goal of all that we have and are.

Every decision that we make in our daily lives must be based upon what God's will is for us. He is not only the king of the world, he must also be the king of our hearts.

ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

May 30th 2019

Besides the hope and the joyful expectancy of heaven so characteristic of the Ascension feast, there is a note of melancholy. Before the final departure of Jesus, the Apostles must have been very much disturbed: each felt the distress of one who sees his dearest friend and companion going away forever, and finds himself alone to face all the difficulties of life. The Lord realized their state of mind and consoled them once more, promising the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Comforter: "He commanded them," (Acts 1:1-11), "that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but should wait for the promise of the Father... you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit, not many days hence."



Even at this the Apostles did not understand. They needed to be enlightened and transformed by the Holy Spirit in order to accomplish the great mission which was to be entrusted to them. Jesus continued "You shall receive the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon you and you shall be witnesses unto Me... even to the uttermost part of the earth."
