## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

*Almighty ever-living God, who willed the Paschal Mystery to be encompassed as a sign in fifty days, grant that from out of the scattered nations the confusion of many tongues may be gathered by heavenly grace into one great confession of your name. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23b-26

Reflection before the Gospel: *"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love."*

### Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 104:1, 24, 29-31, 34

This is a hymn of praise for the God of creation. We praise God for He sent out His Spirit to create the world. After we sinned and damaged creation, God sent forth His Spirit again to renew the face of the earth. We are a new creation, not subject to the destructive effects of sin.

This is not to say that the renewal is totally complete, for we live in the dawning of the kingdom and not its fulfillment. We have already received the Holy Spirit, which is God's down payment of the glory that awaits us, but we are also still awaiting the total fulfillment of the promises Jesus made. Yet the kingdom has dawned and if we look at things through the eyes of Jesus, we will see God's power at work in our midst.

We are totally dependent upon the generosity of God. As with all living creatures, we cannot survive if He withholds His breath. Likewise, if God withholds His Spirit, our spiritual life will perish. But if we trust in Jesus and find all of our strength in God, then we will not have to fear. God will give us life that is so profound that even death will not conquer it.

### PENTECOST



"And when the days of Pentecost were drawing to a close, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a violent wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as of fire, which settled upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in foreign tongues, even as the Holy Spirit prompted them to speak." (Acts 2:1-4)
