Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

2nd Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Reflections: *"What is it that God really has promised us? Will God always make things work out perfectly, or will God at times allow things to be difficult and messy? Will God always be there for us, and if so, what does that mean in everyday terms? Do I at times feel that God is not upholding his part of the bargain?"*

Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-11

Psalm 16 is a psalm of trust in God. Trust is essential, for both the First Reading and the Gospel invited the disciples (and all of us) to leave everything we have to follow our God.

This means that we must surrender many of the things that have brought us security (or at least the illusion of security).

We all have things we hold on to, but we cannot grasp them *and* embrace God.

This could leave us feeling frightened and insecure. But God promises to be our refuge and our portion. Rather than living in fear, we will be filled with joy and surrounded by the delights of our God.

This night was considered to be a time of danger. It was the dawn of when God would intervene and save us from the hands of our enemies.

But in this psalm even the night is safe, for God is always revealing His love for us.
