Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 69:14,17, 30-31, 33-34, 36-37

The Responsorial Psalm is a series of verses taken from an individual lamentation.

In this type of psalm, the psalmist calls out to God in a time of distress, for God is the only one who can help.

The closing verses of almost every lamentation are called the *todah*.

In the *todah* the psalmist proclaims his trust in God, for he is absolutely sure that God will deliver him from all his difficulties.

It is interesting that this psalm speaks of how God will deliver us from our problems, while the Gospel reminds us that we are the ones who have to reach out to others who have difficulties, for anyone who is in need is our brother and sister.

As God has loved us, now we must share that love with all of God's children.

MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN

For our annual mission appeal (weekend of July 20-21), we will have Fr. Nicholas J. Harding who is a priest with the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. Fr. Nicholas is at a huge parish called Cristo Rey in the region of Ica, Peru.



He has been serving for years with one other priest and a Religious Brother. The parish has more than 50 outstations, one of which is a 7-hour drive located 4,300 meters in altitude. Some of the people are of African descent, but most are indigenous. The material poverty is great, but the people are rich in faith. The main purpose for the appeal is support for evangelization and to rebuild a retreat center severely damaged by an earthquake. Also, there is a need to build chapels (multi-purpose) in fast-growing areas.
