## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

*O God, who cause the minds of the faithful to unite in a single purpose, grant your people to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, amid the uncertainties of this world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness is found. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.*

### Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

2nd Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Gospel: St. Luke 13:22-30

Reflection: *The Jewish people who heard today's readings (that from Isaiah and that proclaimed by Jesus) were severely challenged by what was being proclaimed. They thought they knew exactly what God wanted and who was living in God's favor and who was not. Hearing that the Gentiles were being called to be part of God's people would have left them disconcerted, but sometimes that is good. It can be good to be off balance a bit so that we can learn new things.*

*Who would we be hesitant to see among those who are called the chosen of God? Who would it be difficult to believe is a recipient of God's mercy and fidelity?*

### Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 117: 1, 2

The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme found in the First Reading and also in the Gospel, i.e., God reaches out to the nations of the earth.

Up to this time, only the people of Israel had experienced the kindness and fidelity of the LORD.

The word in Hebrew for kindness is "*hesed*," and it means the love that God expresses in the covenant. The word in Hebrew for fidelity is, "*emet*," and it means the truthfulness and loyalty that God shows by keeping his promises even when we do not.

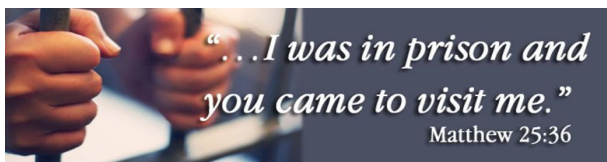
