Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14 and 17

The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme of the wisdom of God and how his ways are far beyond our understanding.

The main theme is that God brings people to life and also brings people to death. We, as human beings, are nothing more than mud and breath.

If God takes back that breath, then we return to the earth. We are fragile, and God is so great.

Furthermore, God even looks at time differently. We count time day by day, but God knows things in eternity. A thousand years in his sight seem like a moment that passes without notice.

Yet, it is remarkable that God who sees all things and is above all things would nevertheless be concerned with every event that occurs upon the earth.

We therefore ask God to intervene and "prosper the work of our hands," for it is only in and through God that our lives are filled with peace.

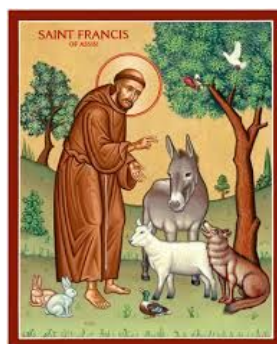
