THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Look upon us, O God, Creator and ruler of all things, and, that we may feel the working of your mercy, grant that we may serve you with all our heart. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14

2nd Reading: 1 Timothy 1:12-17

Gospel: Luke 15:1-32

Reflection: *What does God feel when we sin? Is God angry at us or for us? The latter would mean that God interprets sin as a poison that is killing the spiritual life of his beloved children, and he hates it (the sin, not his children). It would be like a parent might feel concerning a child who is taking drugs. The parent hates the drugs, but continues to love the child.*

Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 51:3-4, 12-13, 17, 19

Psalm 51 is a penitential psalm written to commemorate the day that David repented for his sin against God and against Uriah the Hittite.

The psalm reminds us that we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin by ourselves.

The only way that we can find forgiveness is to have a humble, contrite heart, for it is God who will renew us.

God gave us his Spirit when he created us. If God were to take that Spirit back, then we would return to the dust.

But if God breathes that Spirit into our hearts again, we will be renewed. We will be a new creation.

OUR LADY OF SORROWS

As Mary stood at the foot of the Cross on which Jesus hung, the sword of sorrow Simeon had foretold pierced her soul. Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

- ❖ The prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:25-35)
- ❖ The flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15)
- ❖ Loss of the Child Jesus for three days (Luke 2:41-50)
- ❖ Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary (Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17)
- ❖ Crucifixion and Death of Jesus (John 19:25-30)
- ❖ The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross (Psalm 130; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:31-37)
- ❖ The burial of Jesus (Isaiah 53:8; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42; Mark 15:40-47)

O God, who willed that, when your Son was lifted high on the Cross, his Mother should stand close by and share his suffering, grant that your Church, participating with the Virgin Mary in the Passion of Christ, may merit a share in his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
