THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

Reflection: An experiment was recently performed at a shopping mall. Someone would hold open the door for a stranger passing through. As many as fifty people would go through the door before one of them would turn around to thank the person holding the door. A sense of gratitude is often lost when people develop a sense of entitlement, or they spend all their time thinking about what they don't have instead of being grateful for what they have. Gratitude is the ultimate cure for envy and resentment and a feeling that life is not fair.

Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 98:1, 2-3, 3-4

The Responsorial Psalm is a hymn of praise, the appropriate response that one should have toward God who has done wondrous things for us. One should be willing to tell everyone upon the earth of all God's goodness. God's deeds are so great that even the pagan nations should praise him. We sing a new song. There are two words in Hebrew for new. One means that which is not old, and the other means that which is radically new. God often responds to our need in ways that we could not even imagine or hope for. Yet, it is not always easy to be grateful. We like to think that we can do anything we want with our talents. It is an act of vulnerability to admit that, on our own, we could never have done what we have done.
