## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Almighty and merciful God, graciously keep from us all adversity, so that, unhindered in mind and body alike, we may pursue in freedom of heart the things that are yours. ### Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

2nd Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

*Sometimes telling our difficulties to God or to a friend can make it easier to carry our crosses. Rather than feeling that we don't want to burden others with our troubles, we should be vulnerable enough to invite them into our sufferings.*

## Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15

The Responsorial Psalm is a lamentation. In this type of psalm the psalmist calls upon the Lord to deliver him from the hands of his enemies.

He is sure that God will intervene on his behalf for he feels that he has been steadfast to the LORD's ways.

God will certainly stand by those who are just. He will certainly punish those who choose the path of evil.

In the last section, the psalmist speaks of finding refuge under the shadow of God's wings. He is probably speaking of the wings of the cherubim that were placed on top of the Ark of the Covenant.

This was where God appeared to his people, and it was considered to be a place of safety.

### ST. MARGARET'S DAY - NOVEMBER 16th

She was born in 1046, Hungary, where her father was living in exile, and likewise spent her childhood there as an unusually devout and pious girl. In the course of time, she went to England where her father was called to high office in his fatherland by his uncle, King St. Edward III. Margaret's father died suddenly in 1057 and upon leaving England, a mighty storm - or better, divine Providence - brought her to the shores of Scotland. Upon instructions from her mother, Margaret married Malcolm III, King of Scotland, in 1069.

The country was blessed by her holy life and by her deeds of charity for the next thirty years. She zealously trained her eight children in the practice of Christian virtues. In the midst of royal splendor, Margaret chastised her flesh by mortification and vigils, and passed the greater part of the night in devout prayer. Her most remarkable virtue was love of neighbor, particularly love toward the poor.

In honor of St. Margaret who is our parish patron saint, prayer cards are available at her shrine on the right hand side of the sanctuary. Also, a short history of St. Margaret is available in the narthex.

### Prayers in Honor of St. Margaret

*"Almighty God, in whom sinners find mercy and saints find joy, we thank thee for the life and labors of thy servant Margaret whom thou didst call to an earthly throne that she might advance thy heavenly kingdom. Grant that her example of zeal for thy Church and charity towards all may continually increase divine love in our hearts; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."*

*"O God our Father, who didst kindle a flame of divine love in the heart of thy servant Queen Margaret and didst by her humility and kindness show forth the way of royal service: grant that, encouraged by her example and strengthened by her fellowship, we who bear her name may follow her in the joyful spending of ourselves for others; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen"*
