First Sunday OF ADVENT



Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

2nd Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

Remember: What are the images, sights and sounds you notice as you drive around a city or town, or visit stores during this holiday season? What are some of your favorite memories?

Read: Luke 1:26-38

Reflect: God entered into our world in the most intimate, personal and the most vulnerable way humanly possible - being conceived through the divine power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, allowing Himself to be formed and nurtured within her for the nine months of pregnancy.

Review: *From Mary's perspective, what would have been the most difficult part of this divine event to understand?* 1. That she was, from the very beginning of her own existence, full of grace. 2. She was pregnant and still a virgin. 3. What kind of child her baby was. 4. How to explain her pregnancy to Joseph, her family and friends.

Respond: *From your own perspective, how did you come to know about Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary?* 1. It happened all of a sudden. 2. It happened over time. 3. I'm still getting to know about Him. 4. I know "about" Him more than I really know Him personally. 4. I talk to others about Him.

Mary's Immaculate Conception

Sunday, December 8th



When Anne conceived in the natural way and became pregnant with Mary, (who would be born and grow up to be the Virgin Mother of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God), the natural conception was supernaturally protected from any effect of humanity's sin and fallen state.
