BLESSING OF THE HOME ON THE EPIPHANY

If your home has not already been blessed, the head of the household may go through various rooms of the home sprinkling the "water of the three kings," or ordinary holy water if the other has not been blessed. As the various rooms are sprinkled, the head of the household reads the prayer:

"Bless, O Lord, almighty God, this home so that in it there may be health, chastity, victorious strength, humility, goodness and mildness, obedience to do God's laws, and acts of thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and may this Blessing remain upon this house, and upon all who dwell in it. Through Christ our Lord, Amen."

BLESSING OF EPIPHANY CHALK

It is traditional for parish clergy to bless chalk on the Epiphany. The chalk is taken home and is used to mark the year and the initials of the three Magi (Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar), over the door of the house. As a reminder to all who enter and leave through the main door that they also must be ready to leave all, if necessary, and follow Christ. It might be added that this is a beautiful act of faith.
