3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Church accompanies us on our journey through life, through the seasons of the year and within the changing circumstances of our daily lives. The following themes can serve as a guide along this path. They can be used individually, as a family or in groups.

Remember: Is there a person, celebrity or famous person that you follow online? What about a particular author or a trendsetter? Have you ever followed or joined a crowd of enthusiastic people to go listen to, for example, a speaker or an artist perform, without knowing anything about them? Have you ever been surprised by a stranger who offered inspiration?

Read: Mark 1:14-20

Reflect: The word "Gospel" literally means "Good News", but not any type of good news. During the ancient times, it was an official declaration announcing the defeat of an enemy and the end of a war or conflict. In short, it meant the beginning of "peace time" when hostilities had ended. When a "gospel" was announced, we can imagine rejoicing in the streets with victory parades. When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, an army of God's angels appeared on the horizon and announced "Peace on earth". Were they mistaken?

Review: From the perspective of the fishermen, why might they have left home and their jobs to follow Jesus? 1. They felt unfulfilled? 2. They were looking for an adventure? 3. They knew what Jesus was asking of them? 4. They hoped to change the world? 5. Their families encouraged them to leave home?

Respond: From your own perspective, what attracts you to follow Christ? 1. I have some gifts He can use? 2. I can leave the past behind and start afresh? 3. He has a clear plan of action for me to follow? 4. I like to be with likeminded people? 5. One billion followers can't be wrong?
