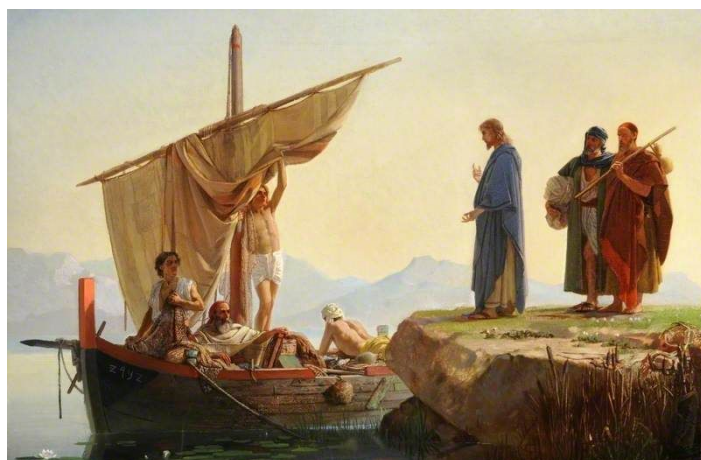

## THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

GOSPEL: MARK 1:14-20



Jesus came to announce to all men the good news of God's eternal plan for them. He spent his public life convincing the Jews of Palestine of the truth of this message, and he died on the cross because he claimed to be that he was God's divine Son, who had come in human nature to raise all men to the standing and status of adopted sons of God. That very death, cruel and unjust though it was, was part of the divine plan. He conquered death and was raised from the grave to prove that we too, if we accept his divine gospel and live by it, will be raised from the dead and reign with Christ in the kingdom of his Father forever.

### THE CHURCH COMPASS

The Church accompanies us on our journey through life, through the seasons of the year and within the changing circumstances of our lives. The following themes can serve as a guide along this path. They can be used individually, as a family or in groups.

**Remember:** Is there a person or a celebrity that you follow online? Perhaps an author or trendsetter? Have you followed or joined a crowd of enthusiastic people to go listen to, for example, a speaker or an artist perform, without knowing anything about them? Have you ever been surprised by a stranger who offered inspiration?

**Read:** Mark 1:14-20

**Reflect:** The word “Gospel” literally means “Good News”. During the ancient times it was an official declaration announcing the defeat of an enemy and the end of a war or conflict. In short it meant the beginning of “peace time” when hostilities had ended. When a “gospel” was announced, we can imagine rejoicing in the streets and victory parades. When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, an army of God’s angels appeared on the horizon and announced “Peace on earth”. Were they mistaken?

**Review:** From the perspective of the fishermen, why might they have left home and their jobs to follow Jesus? 1. They felt unfulfilled? 2. They were looking for an adventure? 3. They knew what Jesus was asking of them?

**Respond:** From your perspective, what attracts you to follow Christ?

Dear Friends,

As we enter into a monumental week in the history of our nation, the bishop has asked all his priests to use their ordinary Sunday Masses, the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation.

The Eucharistic Prayer is the central act of worship in the Mass which immediately leads up to and follows from the consecration of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. In the ordinary form of the Mass, the priest might typically use one of four Eucharistic Prayers. However, in the revised Roman Missal there are as many as ten Eucharistic Prayers which can be used depending on the need and circumstances. The Eucharist Prayer for Reconciliation, if chosen, might typically be used during a weekday during the penitential season of Lent.

Although Ash Wednesday is only a month away, the themes contained in the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation are relevant even now. This prayer reminds us of the effects of sin, the testing of our hearts, and the sacrifice of Christ who continually seeks to restore the unity of the human family for the sake of our heavenly Father’s plan of salvation for the world. Below, I offer you the preface of this rarely used Eucharistic Prayer, hoping that you will keep its words in your mind and heart, particularly during this coming week.

Of course, the traditional prayer to St. Michael the Archangel is also very much appropriate after Mass as we are sent as missionary disciples and witnesses of Christ into the battlefield of a world in much need of being reconciled with our Heavenly Father.
