## THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

GOSPEL: MARK 16: 15-20



At the end of His earthly life Jesus ascends triumphantly into heaven. The Church acclaim Him in His holy humanity, invited to sit on the Father's right hand and to share His glory. But Christ's Ascension is the pledge of our own. Filled with an immense hope, the Church looks up towards her leader, who precedes her into the heavenly home and takes her with Him in His own person: "for the Son of God, after incorporating in Himself those whom the devil's jealousy had banished from the earthly paradise, ascends again to His Father and takes them with Him"

## THE CHURCH COMPASS

### Christ's Ascension into Heaven

The Church accompanies us on our journey through life, through the seasons of the year and within the changing circumstances of our daily lives. The Following themes can serve as a guide along this path. They can be used individually, as a family or in groups.

**REMEMBER:** Have you ever experienced heartfelt goodbyes in your life, perhaps the someone you love finally leaving home, going on a long journey, perhaps to go on deployment for an extended time, or leaving one's own country and family to find work?

**REFLECT:** From our perspective on earth, we often imagine heaven as a separate place, somewhere that is "up there", beyond the clouds. Sometimes we refer to those in heaven as "looking down" on us. Forty days after his resurrection from the dead, Christ left the physical dimensions of our world and entered into the realm of heaven, beyond our natural sight. However, the heavenly Jesus Christ is still here with us, He assured us where two or three were gathered in His name, He would be there. In the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, Christ is perfectly present within our own reality even though our natural senses are not yet fully compatible with heavenly perception.

**REVIEW:** From your own perspective; which of your natural senses needs to be enhanced with God's grace in order to behold the heavenly Christ before you? A. My hearing: so I can hear Him speaking directly to me. B. My eyesight: so that I can see Him before me through the Blessed Sacrament. C. My taste: so that I can speak intimately with Him. D. My touch: so that I can connect with Him through those around me. E. My sense of smell: so that you can recognize him in the fragrance of the garden and nature.

Dear friends,

Of course I know that transitions of pastors from one parish to another are often difficult, not only for the flock, but also for the priests involved.
