SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY GOSPEL OF LUKE 1:39-56



Every Sunday in our Creed, we profess boldly that “we believe in the Resurrection of the Dead and Life everlasting.” Our salvation, our journey to the everlasting homeland, is not merely a “spiritual” thing, pertaining to an inner soul or invisible spirit. Our salvation is also very much an earthly and physical thing that has equally as much to do with our bodies which are living temples of God. All of our physical actions move in sync with our spirit. As our spirit yearns for salvation, so do our bodies.

Mary was available to be the mother of the Son of God, able to form in her womb the body of Christ, because her own body was in perfect harmony with her soul. She becomes for us the model of the perfect disciple of the Christian life, which is

modeled by Christ who gave us His own physical body and blood with its saving power.

On August 15, the Christian faithful in Jerusalem gather around the tomb of Mary and they, like the Church, are careful to note that this is not the final resting place of her body. For her tomb is empty because her body and soul were so perfectly attuned to each other, where one went the other would surely follow. We thank our Father in Heaven for the perfect choice of Mary. We pray that our physical movements, expressions and actions will be in harmony with the spirit of Christ in our lives so our final resting place for our bodies will be not the grave but our eternal homeland.

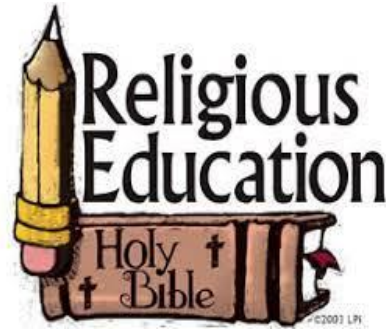
MASS FOR SURVIORS OF SUICIDE LOSS

ST. STEPHEN OF HUNGARY

St. Stephen was the first Christian king of Hungary. He was born in 975 at Gran, the son of Prince Geisa, and was baptized in 985 by St. Adalbert. He received the royal crown from Pope Sylvester II (999-1003) and was solemnly enthroned at Gran on the feast of Mary's Assumption, 1001. Stephen was one of the wisest princes of his time. His royal generosity is shown in his love toward the poor and the establishment of the archbishopric of Gran and ten Hungarian bishoprics. Because he visited them in their homes and washed their feet, his right hand has remained incorrupt. Great was his zeal in prayer and meditation. From his marriage to Gisela, (sister of Emperor St. Henry II), came a saintly son, the devout Emeric, an angel of purity, who died seven years before his father. By prayer and fasting Stephen sought the conversion of all Hungary, and rightfully, he is called the apostle of his nation. He chose the Mother of God as the patroness of Hungary.
