### Remote Learning – Saint Ann School

The administration and teachers have prepared for continuation of education in the event school closure is deemed necessary. While remote learning is not a substitute for traditional classroom instruction and interactions it will continue to provide curriculum to students. Remote learning will allow Saint Ann School to meet the 180 instructional school day requirement as set forth by the state. The program's success depends on collaboration between the parents, students, and faculty.

### Expectations and Requirements

#### Faculty

- Communication – contact students with assignments. Check-in with students AND parents regarding any questions, issues, needs
- Create assignments and deliver to students by preferred manner of delivery. This includes but is not exclusive of, Google Classroom, email, webpage, etc.
- Assess, provide feedback, grade assignments regularly
- Availability – create a time of availability (office hours) for students and parents to make contact

#### Students

- Time Management – complete assignments in the timeline outlined by each teacher. Provide time to review, research, complete assigned work
- Communication – contact teacher with any questions. Communicate with classmates for assignments (as needed)
- Check Google classroom, teacher webpage, email, and other sources of teacher communication
- Follow instructions and guidelines as provided by teacher

#### Parent/Guardian

- Monitor – Check in daily with your child(ren) about assignments, activities, assessments, and projects.
- Check Google classroom, teacher webpage, email, and other sources of teacher communication
- Provide a quiet place for student to complete their work independently (depending on grade level)
- Communication – contact teacher with any questions. Also, communicate with your child(ren)
- Encourage 3.5-4 hours of active school work daily
