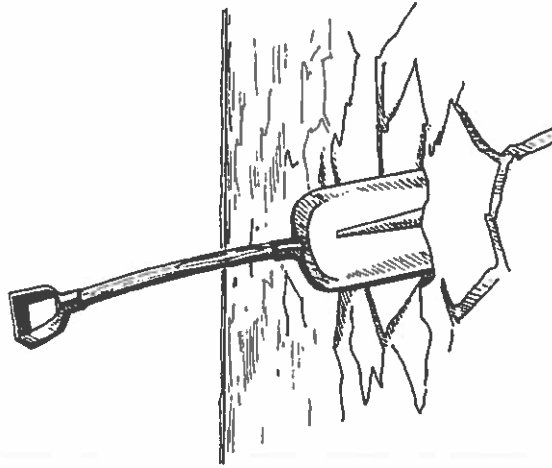
To make the story more interesting, authors often leave clues to help the reader understand the story's events and characters' feelings. As you read, use the clues the author gives you to infer what is happening.
