The story of the widow's mite is a famous story, and I presume that we know why it is remarkable. In the same narrative, our Lord indicated why the charity of the widow was exceptional. We may reread it in case we have forgotten. Two of the important things we might learn from the charitable act of this widow are: First, what matters most in our charitable works are how significant they are in the eyes of God who sees everything, and not how significant they are in the eyes of people. Second, the greatness of our charitable work depends more on the loss we endured because of the act of charity.

Reflecting on the losses we have endured, this weekend is a special weekend in our country because of the sacrifices our veterans endured while serving this country selflessly. We pray that God grants eternal peace to our veterans who have passed away, and continues to bless the ones who are with us in our homes and communities.
