**Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu**

Both the first reading and the gospel remind us once more that Jesus is the light of the world that brings joy and great rejoicing. He does these by directing us to Faith in God, the greatest gift that one would ever have. Jesus gave the gift to the four fishermen He called in the gospel of today. He asked them to follow Him, and they did. He told them that they would join Him in distributing this special gift to all people by telling them that He would make them "fishers of men."

In the same way, Jesus needs you and me to join Him in catching souls for God. He would like us to use our various vocations in life or our different careers to bring people to God. Just like Jesus used the talents of the fishermen to catch people for God, He would also use our various skills to bring people to God. Pope Francis said, in one of his reflections, after praying the Angelus at the Vatican, "the Lord continues to walk in the streets of our daily lives calling us to join Him to call people for God's reign in our time. Each one of you must realize that the Lord is watching you. When He calls you to follow Him or join Him to bring others to follow Him, you must do so with courage. He will never disappoint you". Our Christian life is more than occupying the pews at Mass. Our Lord would also like us to use our unique ways to catch souls for God. St. Paul urges us in the second reading to be "united in the same mind and the same purpose." What purpose? He would like us to follow Christ and bring others along to know God.

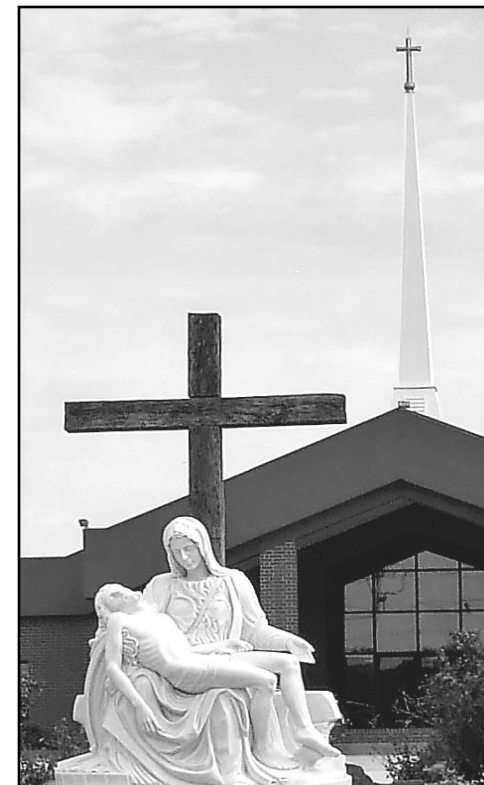
