Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu

Before a Dutch painter, Vincent Van Gogh, became famous, he once expressed that even though he was not financially wealthy, he considered himself rich because his love of painting enriched his heart and soul with the greatest joy no amount of money could give him. One could say the same thing about Peter and his pastoral work of witnessing Christ to the people of his days. The pastoral work of Peter (1st Reading) was challenging and risky to his life, but witnessing Christ enriched his heart and soul and gave him great joy to the extent of not being afraid to lose his life. His joy was motivated by his knowledge of Jesus, as Jesus describes Himself in today's gospel, "I am the good shepherd . . . I know mine and mine know me". In the Bible, to know is to love. and Peter knew that Christ loves His own and expects them to love him and others. The words of Jesus in this gospel is similar to the covenant words in the several chapters of the Old Testament, "I will be your God, and you shall be my people . . . walk in the way that I command you, and it may be well with you" (Jeremiah 7:13). Nothing was more enriching to Peter than doing the will of the Lord so that the Lord would bless him and others with salvation. Those words of Jesus in Jn 10:14 indicate that He loves us and invites us to imitate Him in acts of love. Peter imitated Him, and in the name of Jesus, the cripple man walked (1st Reading). Christ, the Good Shepherd, loves us and asks us to do the same. St. Mark, whose feast day falls on this weekend, loved (God and others) as the Lord commanded. The Good Shepherd would also like us to follow Him and emulate His caring love as much as we can. Fr. Leo


