Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu

The parable in today's gospel challenges us with the kind of relationship we should have with Christ and with one another. Christ said, "I am the vine, and you are the branches." The parable refers to the relationship Christ wishes to have with His disciples – an interconnectedness where the branches (disciples) get life from the Vine (Christ) and support another too. Let us not forget that branches emanate from other branches, which leads to many branches from the same tree. Hence, McCarthy (New Sunday and Holy Day Liturgies, 1999) described the vine branches as a supportive community, thereby reminding us that Christians should live as a community that relates well with Christ and with one another. Of course, the love of God and one another is the greatest commandment. Today's parable metaphorically explains it very well.

The bad Apostle, Judas, and many Judases in the world today come to my mind when I think of Christ's expression that anyone who does not remain in Him will wither. The self-serving attitude of Judas and his odious relationship with Christ and with the other apostles and how he died is a known story. Therefore, we pray that we may not be among the Judases in the world today, but Christians who relate well with God and one another.


