## **The Holy Trinity**

The dogma of our faith is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But we can submit humbly and say: Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.

Even though today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity, we should recall a spirit of gratitude for the gifts which the Blessed Trinity bestows upon us every day. #### Diocese of Tulsa to mourn 1921 Race Massacre

The Most Rev. David A. Konderla and Pastor Rev. Dr. Robert R.A. Turner, Pastor of Tulsan Historic Vernon Chapel A.M.E. Church will lead an ecumenical Vespers prayer service on May 30, 7 p.m., at Holy Family Cathedral, to remember the centennial anniversary of the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre.

In the midst of the violence in 1921, Father James Heiring, then the pastor of Holy Family Cathedral, opened the doors of the church to provide refugee and offer protection for those fleeing the violence. According to an article published by the Tulsa Tribune on June 6, 1921, the Cathedral's nuns, its ladies of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and its Knights of Columbus provided food, clothing, and shelter to some 400 black victims of the riot. "The prayer service will be a time to acknowledge a grave evil

"The prayer service will be a time to acknowledge a grave evil that took place and mourn the lives lost and destroyed as well as a time to celebrate the courage of those people who served as shining lights in that dark time to help the victims," said Bishop Konderla.

## DIOCESAN POLICIES & PROCEDURES FOR THE PUBLIC MASS & SACRAMENTS

Bishop Konderla has <u>restored the Sunday obligation starting Saturday</u>, <u>May 22, 2021</u>, and has issued updated policies and procedures. <u>Other Policies Include</u>:

1) Face Coverings for those attending Mass are optional
2) Social Distancing at Mass--Overall, the majority of Masses offered by a parish and the majority of all seating at any Mass should be open seating.
3) The following should be reinstated (a) the use of hymnals, missalettes, and other similar materials; (b) the use of Holy Water founts; (c) the normal practice of collections during Mass; (d) the procession of the gifts; (e) the sign of peace; (f) a normal routine of sanctuary sanitization; (g) a normal routine of exiting the sanctuary after Mass; (h) "cry rooms" and other similar facilities; (i) social receptions after Mass; and (j) the use of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Although holding hands during the Lord's Prayer is still prohibited, as it is not part of the Mass in the Roman rite.

4) Masses may still be livestream via social media, but should not otherwise be posted or stored online—persons viewing a livestream should only have the opportunity to do so during the live celebration of the Mass.


