

Kindergarten – Chapter Schedule

Each week, the parent/guardian and child should work together studying the Chapter in the textbook. When completed, follow the schedule for that week's requirements.

For Kindergarten, the children do not have to complete any eAssessments or send in any work in to me. This is a guideline for the parents.

Students should not work ahead as this schedule follows the church year.

PARENTS – *Please take a few moments to look over your child's textbook. The beginning and end of the book have many additional resources for you, especially the prayers on pages 180-187. You may tear these pages from the book and place them somewhere where your child can see them often.*

- Sept. 13 Chapter 1 – read through chapter and answer questions in textbook.
Parents can review these with their children.
This is such a fun chapter for the children as it introduces the child to God and the Story of Creation!
Please pray together the Prayer of Thanks on page 29.
(It's always nice to introduce your children to prayer, letting them know that they are talking to God and, most importantly, **that God is listening.**)
- Sept. 20 Chapter 2 – read through chapter
This teaches children that God made each child special and unique.
Please pray together the Thank You, God! Prayer on page 35
(At the end of each chapter, please pray the prayer together.)
- Sept. 27 Chapter 3
This chapter teaches the children of God's Love.
It also helps children learn how to care for God's creations.
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 43-46
- Oct. 4 Chapter 4 – this lesson teaches about the First Person of the Holy Trinity, God the Father.
Please pray the I Believe (page 51) with your child.
- Oct. 11 Chapter 5 – This is a very important lesson.
It helps your child understand the importance of prayer.
On page 57, your child can learn visually how to make the Sign of the Cross (Use your right hand to make the Sign of the Cross.) You may want to tear this page from the book and post it somewhere that the child can see it often (in their room, on the refrigerator, etc.)
- Oct. 18 Chapter 6 – read through the chapter
This chapter teaches your child how to care for God's creation.
Spend some time discussing ways that they can, even at their young age, show God that they love and appreciate God's world.
- Oct. 25 Chapter 7 – read through chapter
While this chapter seems early (not December), it introduces your child to the second person of the Holy Trinity (Jesus.)

- Nov. 1 All Saints' Day – This is a special day Catholics practice celebrating all those who have entered Heaven, including saints who are recognized by the Church and those who are not. (There are people who have lived a saintly life, but have not had the recognition of “saint” by the church; however, through the eyes of God, they are saints.) Since this is a Holy Day of Obligation this year, take a break from your lesson and pray to your favorite saint, asking this saint to intercede (to pray with you to Jesus) your prayer requests.
- Nov. 8 Chapter 8 – read chapter
This continues their lesson on Jesus
- Nov. 13 Chapter 9 – read through chapter
This chapter continue their lesson on Jesus, using Bible stories.
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 87-90.
- Nov. 20 Let's prepare for Thanksgiving by thanking someone special!
Write that person a letter (handwritten by student) expressing why the child is thankful for them. Be sure to include the reasons why they appreciate them.
DO NOT SUBMIT THIS TO ME. This is between you and that special person.
- Nov. 27 Happy Thanksgiving! Corpus Christi is thankful for each and every one of YOU!
Thank you, Parents, for being an example of our Catholic faith!
- Nov. 29 Read pages 10-11 in your textbook.
Does your family have an Advent wreath? *It is time to light the first purple candle.*
You will light another candle each week. First week, purple; second week, purple,
Third week, rose (pink); and fourth week, purple
Purple represents prayer and penance, and rose (pink) represents joy!
- Dec. 6 Chapter 10
Read through chapter
Do you remember learning the hand story “Here's the Church” found on page 91.
Teach this to your child. Can they name people they may know in our parish?
This is a special chapter teaching your child that we belong to a church “family.”
- Dec. 13 Chapter 11
Read chapter. This introduces your child to the Holy Spirit (the Third Person of the Holy Trinity.)
- Dec. 20 Read pages 12 and 13.
- Dec. 25 Merry Christmas! Jesus Christ is born!
- Dec. 27 Christmas break.
- Jan. 1 The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (Holy Day of Obligation)
Please check your church bulletin for Mass times
- Jan. 3 Chapter 12 – Read through chapter
How can we serve others?
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 109-112.
- Jan. 10 Chapter 13 -- Read through chapter.
This teaches your child about the Law of Love (“Love one another as I have loved you.” *John 15: 9,12*)
- Jan. 17 Chapter 14 – read through Chapter
This helps your child to think about the choices they make in life. They should use the practice of: STOP, THINK, and then CHOOSE.
- Jan. 24 Chapter 15 – Read through Chapter.
This chapter focuses on Forgiveness.
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 131-135.

- Jan. 31 Chapter 16 – Read through Chapter.
This chapter talks about signs that Jesus used to show people God’s love.
We have many signs in our church called Sacramentals, such as Holy Water Fonts, Candles, Oils, etc. Can your child name some Sacramentals that they have seen in our church?
- Feb. 7 Chapter 17 – Read through the chapter
This chapter is about Baptism. Tell your child about their baptism.
What did he/she wear? Do you still have their Baptismal candle?
Who was present at the Baptism? Does your child know who their godparents are?
Please express the importance that this was the day that your child became a member of our Catholic family.
- Feb. 14 Chapter 18 – Read the chapter.
As the year has progressed, the lessons become more advanced.
This chapter focuses on the Bread and Wine at Mass.
This is a very important chapter ... please take special time reviewing it.
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 153-156.
- Feb. 21 Chapter 19 –
Parents/Guardians, read through this chapter before you present it to your child
This chapter teaches your child about Heaven.
Please take special CARE in teaching this lesson.
- Feb. 28 Chapter 20 –
This chapter focuses on Acts of Kindness.
It also introduces your child to Saints.
Discuss how we can be like a saint.
- Mar. 7 Chapter 21 – Read through the Chapter
On page 174, there is a Family Project that your child should make that will help him/her and all your family members to remember to pray each and every day. It can be a simple prayer such as, “God, watch over us today.” Or it can be a prayer such as the “Our Father.”
Your child may make their own Scripture Story book on Pages 175-178.
- Mar. 14 We are in the middle of the Lenten season. Read pages 16 and 17.
