Important Notice

Follow Christ

If you go to London and visit Westminster Abbey you can see where William Wilberforce was buried among the nobility and powerful. Who was William Wilberforce? He served almost 50 years as a British politician in late 1700 and early 1800 until his death in 1833. He was a man before his time, a man of strong Christian faith and an ardent supporter of universal education, religious liberty and the abolition of slavery. Oftentimes he must have felt all alone as if "swimming against the tide" with such stances, especially slavery. Every year for 17 years he raised the slavery issue in British Parliament until finally in the 18th year the bill to abolish slavery was assured to pass. He died 3 days later! It is hard to believe it took Christians so long to condemn slavery! In the 2nd reading today from St. Paul to Philemon we hear that Paul did not outright condemn slavery as it was part and parcel of the social structure in his time. However, as we read through the shortest letter attributed to Paul (only 25 verses long), he in effect planted the seed for the destruction of the institution of slavery insisting that all people are created equal, whether slave or free, and urging Christians who had slaves to treat them with compassion (unheard of in that time). In today's story there are only 3 people: Paul, old and chained in jail awaiting his final fate, Onesimus the runaway slave and Philemon the Christian slave owner. After Paul baptizes Onesimus into the Christian faith he writes to Philemon urging him to receive Onesimus back not as a "slave" but as a "dear brother." We are all sisters and brothers dear to Christ! And thus we have an obligation to swim against the tide and do what is required to love God and neighbor, not just go along with the crowd. As followers of Christ we will frequently not be popular with today's societal views on life issues such as abortion, infanticide, capital punishment and euthanasia. But we have to speak out against these evils. While consumerism, power, prestige and pleasure are emphasized by today's society, we are not to be enslaved by these worldly aspirations. By our baptism we are called to follow Christ, to be holy, and this will oftentimes require us to be different, the odd one out, to swim against the tide. Following Christ means more than attending Mass every Sunday (although this is very important!) – we are called to live out the Gospel (the Good News) the rest of the week and this can be much more of a challenge. We make decisions every day by the choices we make, with the grace freely given and abundantly provided by God. Jesus came to comfort the disturbed and to disturb the comfortable. Maybe we have been disturbed a little today by the readings, but a little bit of disturbance may not be a bad thing if it reminds us to follow Christ in our lives, even if a bit uncomfortable at times.

What will Sunday's look like with the new Faith Formation Program for Grades 1-6?

Our lives have evolved into times of great busyness and we as parents strive to find balance, where God holds a privileged place on Sunday. We also feel the need to connect our students and parents comfortably on Sunday with well planned liturgies at the 9am Mass. We hope our reduced schedule meeting on 7 Sundays in the fall and 6 in the winter (half the time of previous programs) allows families time to be together. Adults are encouraged (not mandated) to come together for fellowship (coffee and...) as well as spiritual enrichment while their children are in class.
