## Coronavirus Requirements

Following state guidelines, in place until December 2, all Masses and indoor gatherings are limited to 25 people. Please continue to sign up for Mass in advance. In order to protect the vulnerable members of our parish, anyone five years old and up **MUST WEAR A FACE MASK**, with the exception of the presider, lectors, and cantors when proclaiming or singing during the Mass. Sanitize hands upon entering the church and maintain physical distance, especially during the distribution of Holy Communion.

## Parish Priest's Corner

### Christ the King

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

**GROW:** Today, we acknowledge and celebrate Christ the King. It's hard to put this royal image together with today's Gospel passage, where Jesus is not asking to be treated like a king, but rather instructing us to perform merciful deeds for the least of his brothers and sisters. Yet it is the perfect follow-on to the previous three Sundays' Scriptures, where Jesus tells us what it means to live a life of holiness, preparation, and faithful investment in the Kingdom. Now we see what awaits those of us who turn over our lives to him, seeing the face of Jesus in the least among us – the poor, the imprisoned, the thirsty, the stranger. "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

**GO:** I confess that judgment day readings scare me a little. Some days I behave more like a "goat" than a "sheep." I have concluded that Jesus is not talking about farm animals here. He is talking about us humans and the choices we make or do not make through sins of omission. The list seems endless if I focus on all the things I *could* be doing to help others each and every day. Yet, rather than getting caught up in fear or guilt, today's readings encourage me, and remind me, that Jesus has told us what we need to do to be counted as "sheep" on the last day.

#### ACTIONS:

- Choose one corporal work of mercy today and act on it. What does it look like to "visit the sick?" You may not be able to go for an in-person visit due to the pandemic, but could you call a parishioner and visit with them over the phone? Make food for someone who is not feeling well? Check in on an elderly neighbor?
- Do you know some "sheep" – people who radiate faith and kindness to others? Just as you might network with a professional in your field, connect with that person. Ask them about their faith and how it inspires them in their daily lives.

### **Announcement: Healing Mass**

The pandemic has taken a toll on all of us. Some of us or the people we know have contracted the coronavirus, some of our fellow citizens have died from it, leaving loved ones in grief, many are suffering psychologically, emotionally, spiritually, physical, mentally. Now more than ever, everyone is in need of healing in one form or another. Who do we turn to, who do we go to for healing except our Wounded Healer Jesus Christ, about whom Isaiah 53:5 says: "**By His stripes we are healed.**"

Beginning in December, there will be a healing Mass at Holy Trinity every first Friday of the month. The program for the healing Mass is as follows:

**6:00pm: Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with hymns.**

**6:20pm: Mass (Anointing during Mass)**

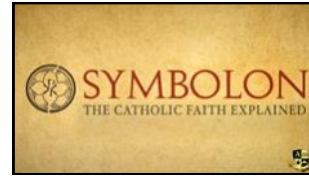

#### Statement on the Governor's Latest Restrictions

I am speaking out publicly to express my great disappointment and frustration at the Governor's latest restrictions on faith communities in Oregon. I understand the need to address the spike in COVID-19 cases, but we know that spread of the virus is not happening at faith gatherings. Our churches have been carefully following the masking, distancing, and sanitizing protocols. They work. Why are we limited to 25 people in a church that can seat 1000 while certain businesses are allowed to operate on a percentage of capacity? I would like to know the Governor's rationale for tighter restrictions on churches. It is not data driven. It does not make sense. Our neighbors to the north in Washington are facing greater spread and tighter restrictions, yet their Governor's formula for restrictions on faith communities is much more reasonable (25% occupancy or 200 maximum). It follows the science. A similar policy makes sense for Oregon.

The Catholic Church and other faith communities have bent over backwards to observe Governor Brown's directives and implement strict protocols to keep people safe since the pandemic began. We operate in a controlled environment where we can keep everyone who enters our doors from having "close contact." We are asking the Governor, following the two week "freeze," to reconsider her gathering restrictions for faith communities. We ask her to remember that the Christmas holiday is a little over a month away, and it is a season when people of many faiths turn to their churches. We need a policy that matches our current situation, keeps people safe, and meets the spiritual needs of people of faith in Oregon. It is unfortunate that a person's ability to worship does not seem to be considered an essential activity. I can assure you that the Catholic faithful under my pastoral care consider Sunday worship vital, especially when facing the challenges of the pandemic.

The Catholic community continues to pray for the Governor and her staff while she does the very challenging work of navigating the state of Oregon through this terrible pandemic.

RE: Wearing of Masks at Mass

Dear Brothers in Christ,

It has come to my attention that in some parishes the wearing of masks during Mass is not being enforced. I have received multiple complaints about a number of parish situations in which persons are coming to Mass without masks or removing them once they enter the church building. We did not set this requirement arbitrarily nor for any political motivation. We put it in place because the state mandated us to do so and because the best medical evidence (supported by medical professionals, including devout and faithful Catholic physicians) tells us that wearing masks, social distancing and sanitizing are the most effective ways to curb the spread of COVID-19. We have repeatedly asked that this be done, as a matter of Christian charity and concern for your neighbor. Now I am telling you that you have the right and the duty to enforce the state-wide mask mandate in your parishes. If people come to Mass without a mask, they should not be allowed to enter. If they remove their masks inside the church, they should be asked to put them back on or leave. Failing to follow this requirement puts their fellow parishioners at medical risk and puts everyone's ability to worship in jeopardy.

I must insist that you take this message seriously. We are continuing to work with state authorities to protect our right to worship. Now that I have gone public with my objections to the new restrictions, it is important that we clearly be seen to be following state requirements with respect to those things we know slow down the spread of the virus.
