Dear friends in Christ,

Last weekend we inaugurated a new Knights of Columbus council for Holy Trinity and St. John's. The name of this new council is the Council of the Most Holy Trinity. This name was so chosen to serve as a constant reminder to all the members and their families that just as every aspect of our Catholic faith begins and ends with the creative, saving, and sanctifying power of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, so too their lives are to become examples of God's presence in the world.

When I first thought about starting a new Knights of Columbus Council, my aim was to spiritually support the men and families in our parish so that through them, the good news of salvation can reach many souls in our community. At first, I was not quite sure how we would meet the minimum requirement of having at least twenty men to start a new council.
