From Father Jordan

My Brothers and Sisters in the Lord, May the Grace of Our Lord remain always with us!

Days of Joy and a Weekend of Grace

In last week's *From Father Jordan* I complimented Mr. Bob and Miss Kristen for their great work with Vacation Bible School. Of course, I wrote those words while Vacation Bible School was still in session. I want to share more of what I witnessed, and the gifts and graces our children were given:

- The students who attended Vacation Bible School were given some of the most creative and faithful catechesis I have seen in the last ten years. Mr. Bob and Miss Kristen were able to teach our children about 5 wonderful Saints, as well as Bible Studies from both the Old and New Testaments.
- The children really "got" what they were being taught. Saint Juan Diego is known for his tilma on which Our Lady imprinted her image. Mr. Bob and Miss Kristen presented that lesson in a very creative way: first, tilma is like an apron by which something is carried, or in the case of Saint Juan Diego, an apron that bears a particular image or message. Each of the students made their own tilma to wear, but they also saw a tilma being used to carry water balloons. Later in the week, Miss Kristen gathered her shirt in front of her to carry supplies for the students. One boy remarked, "Look, Miss Kristen is wearing a tilma!" From the mouths of babes... there are more stories like this one that can be told.
- One parent told me that when she was getting her children ready for Vacation Bible School the next day, her 4-year-old corrected her and said, "Mom, it's just vacation..." Another parent told me that her child cried when she was told her family had no way to get her to Vacation Bible School the next day.... Thank God for Nana to the rescue!
- Families were given the opportunity to know one another better, or to meet each other for the first time; and, we attracted people from outside of the

Parish. This newly knit community is so strong that several of the families came to Andrew Hill's baptism at the 11:00 am Mass last Sunday: what an untold blessing.

Vacation Bible School was something we never did before; something that stretched us; something many thought would never work. By God's grace and Our Lady's intercession, Vacation Bible School did more than work – it flourished! Mr. Bob and Miss Kristen are already planning for "VBS 2020"!

Last weekend our Parish was blessed to have three baptisms. We have had 32 new families join the Parish since January and many have young children. Each baptism was perfect: beautiful babies' loving and grateful families; a sense of JOY that no one could take from us. This past week and weekend have been the happiest of my 13 months as your Pastor.

<u>Joy</u>

Communities that are joyful grow – it is that simple. This can be seen in school communities; religious orders old and new; parishes that spring up in the most unexpected places, and parishes that come back from the brink of ceasing to exist. Joy attracts more than money; works; or personalities: joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God! As I often told you, joy is not a slap on the back and being "hail fellow well met"; joy is laughing and crying together; joy is agreeing and disagreeing with one another; joy is teasing one another about our peccadillos; joy is the presence of the Holy Spirit that proclaims over and over again that sin, death, hell and sorrow do not have the final word - only God and His Triumphant Love have the final word! May Saint Sebastian's ever be and become even more a community of Joy, a temple of Praise, a home where there is always a four - year - old's "just vacation"!


25th, 40th, 50th and Over -Wedding Anniversary Celebration

Elementary School Tuition Assistance

Saint Sebastian offers tuition assistance for those parents who have children attending Catholic Elementary School. Based upon taxable income, this assistance is part of the parish's assessment to the Diocese. Families seeking tuition assistance are asked to contact Father Jordan.

The Diocese of Providence states:

All tuition assistance is to be based on demonstrated economic need objectively assessed and awarded in a graduated manner according to that need. The FACTS Grant & Aid program is to be used for this purpose. Applications are available online at www.online.factsmgt.com. Students must be registered at one of our Catholic Schools to apply for aid. Those applying for assistance are to pay the application fee.

Any individual applying for tuition assistance using the FACTS Grant & Aid program will be considered for financial aid from his/her parish, and all Diocesan tuition assistance fund accounts, including Frances Warde, Anchor of Hope, FACE of RI tax credit, and all others.

Searching for a Director of Music and Organist, and Music at Mass this Summer

The search for a Director of Music and Organist to succeed Stephen Higgins continues. As I have written to you before, this has been and continues to a grueling and frustrating process. A lack of qualified applicants; budgetary constraints; and other issues prolong the search. I have contacted surrounding colleges, the American Guild of Organists, and the School of Music at the Rhode Island Symphony, and have little or no response. I was to sign a letter of agreement with an excellent candidate this past Monday. Sadly, he contacted me on Sunday evening to tell me that he has had a change of heart, and will not be taking the position. Everything happens for a reason, right?

Throughout this process with all the variables created by a prolonged absence of a Music Director, our cantor, Megan Morrow, has been an invaluable rock of hope and a steadying rudder to a ship that needs steering! I am most thankful for Megan's constancy, professionalism, and tremendous flexibility.

We cannot afford many more substitute organist weekends: Megan's salary is in the budget. Substitute organists are an extraordinary budgetary expense. An organist at 3 Masses costs \$525.00 per weekend. *Throughout the summer my family and I have paid for our substitute musicians*: I cannot allow this to continue. Although I love playing the organ, I have played and will play as many Masses as I am able, but I am not here to be the organist: I have come here to be your Pastor. Please join me in prayer that God would send us the organist/Music Director He knows we need, and the musician who needs Saint Sebastian.

BAPTISM

Congratulations of the birth of your child!

We require all parents and godparents to attend Sacramental Preparation Classes. Once you have called the rectory to plan for the baptism of your child, we will have someone contact you to set up a special appointment for Preparation Classes. These classes are usually done one on one with each family and are conducted by a couple who are well prepared to teach and assist in Baptismal Preparation.

MARRIAGE

Congratulations on your engagement and decision to enter into a Catholic marriage! St. Sebastian Parish will help you in your preparation to ensure that you make this serious and sacred step in your life a holy and happy one.

The day and time of your wedding must be arranged in person by the prospective bride and groom themselves as soon as they feel called to marry. No arrangement can be made by phone or parents. All arrangements should be made nine months prior to the wedding date and done prior to scheduling the reception.

The first meeting with the Pastor may be scheduled by calling the Parish Office at (401) 751-0196.

Spiritual preparation is a key part of this special time. Frequent participation in the sacraments during this time is important, particularly weekly Mass attendance. It is also strongly recommended that you bring yourselves to the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this time of preparation.
