



Code of Conduct

Dear Parents,

Thank you for trusting our coaches to encourage and be a role model for your children. We should *all* be in agreement that parents, players, and coaches have important roles to fulfill in order to have a successful sports season at All Saints Catholic School. We also must keep in mind one of the greatest commandments Jesus gave us, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mk 12:31). Showing respect for all on and off the field or court is the most important aspect of any sports season and is the pinnacle of what displaying good sportsmanship means.

With this in mind, here are the expectations for all those involved in building a successful and supportive sports team and season:

PARENTS:

- Parents must respect the coaches, officials and especially the team.
- Parents notify coaches about injuries to prevent anyone from playing with an injury or further injury.
- We will all do our best to work together as a team.
- If you have any questions or concerns, first contact the Athletic Director to resolve.
- If you have to pick up your athlete early from practice please call/text coach or Athletic Director.
- On game days, pickup on State Street (school side)

PLAYERS:

- Players will talk respectfully about other players, coaches and officials.
- If anyone is caught being disrespectful, they will immediately be referred to the Athletic Director
- Please leave your differences at the door.
- The boys and girls teams will have scrimmages against each other.
- We will build each other up and respect each other.
- Starting the first day of practice there is a two week deadline to join or withdraw from a sport.

COACHES:

- Coaches are responsible for scheduling practices and teaching skills, rules and regulations.
- Coaches will elect captains.
 - *A captain's responsibility is to help peers learn skills, rules and regulations (we are as strong as our weakest member, link, or player).
- Coaches have the right to enforce these minor punishments for unacceptable behavior.
 - *Running a lap, wind-sprints, push-ups, sit-ups and squats.
- For more serious issues, coaches will talk to the player's parent(s), and also the athletic director.
 - *Principal will be brought into the discussion for more egregious issues.

Please know, I will also hold myself and assistant coaches to these expectations as I trust parents to help hold the players up to their expectations as well. I truly look forward to coaching these young men and women. I know it will be a great season for all involved.
