## Things of this world are transitory; our only security is in God.

The Gospel passage today hints at a lack of security found in all of our lives. It begins with disciples commenting on the costly adornments of the Temple, the center of Jewish worship. Yet Jesus explains that in the future, even the magnificent Temple will come down: *the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone.*

In what can we be secure? Not the riches or the material possessions of this world.

Jesus continues: *Many will come in my name, saying "I am he," and "the time has come." Do not follow them!* In whom can we be secure? Not the preachers who claim to have all the answers.

What about our family? According to Jesus, some will be betrayed and hurt even by their own family members.

Jesus seems to imply that as much as we would like to put our faith into what we can see, what we can touch, what we can experience in this life, we simply cannot. Our

security cannot lie with anything that is transitory; it cannot rest with anything that is of this world.

Perhaps one reason – perhaps the main reason – we feel so distressed when we lose something or someone of value is because we had anchored our sense of self to that thing or to that person. How many of us, for example, have felt adrift after the loss of a job, the loss of a valuable item, the damage to a reputation or the end of a relationship? It was part of us, part of our identity, a part of our security.

The writer of the Gospel, Luke, certainly understands this. He is writing to a community of believers who have seen the Temple destroyed, who have suffered persecution because of their faith in Christ. Yet there is hope. Jesus tells his followers: *Do not be terrified.* Although they will be surrounded by wars, by persecution, by adversities, they can persevere. Somehow God will sustain them. How? We don't know. But like the bird who migrates long distances or the fish who is carried by the river to the sea, we trust that God will get us where we need to be. Our security is God, not the events of our life or the passing things of this world.

### New Policy in Place

Please note, that if you want to schedule an event at St. Juliana's (ie. Quinceanera, Wedding, Baptism, etc.) you must contact the office to make reservations and/or arrangements. There are registration forms available in the office. Our office number is 478-825-7127 from 12 noon - 5:00 pm M-Th for more information.

### St. Juliana's Catholic Church Policies & Guidelines

#### Baptism

- Parents and Godparents must attend Baptism Prep Class so, please call the office to register for a class.
- Godparents must be Catholics and if married, Married sacramentally. (Not civil union)
- Out of town godparents must provide a letter from their pastor as to their suitability to exercise this office.

#### First Communion and Confirmation

- Family must be registered at St. Juliana's.
- Preparation = two years of classes.
- Children must be at least 7 years old to receive First Communion and at least 13 years old for Confirmation.
- Must provide a baptismal certificate to register.

#### Marriage – Couples must:

- Contact the pastor at least 6 months (or more) prior to desired wedding date.
- Participate in a pre-Cana course or marriage-prep weekend.
- NO wedding date is guaranteed until ALL Diocesan and Parish requirements are fulfilled.

#### Quinceañeras

- Family must be registered at St. Juliana's and attend mass regularly.
- Preparation = workshop.
- Teen must be baptized, received 1st Communion and Confirmation (or in 2nd year of confirmation classes)

**Novena of the Virgin Mary**

**What is a Novena:** They are a series of prayers that are recited for 9 days straight or 9 hours straight. A novena is offered as a sacrifice to God because it is a sign of devotion. And during this prayer devotion, the person saying the novena asks a specific request or intention.

**History:** Over time, members of Roman Catholic faith began to associate **novena** with Christian themes such as the **nine** months Jesus spent in the womb, the giving up of His spirit at the **ninth** hour, and the event which occurred in the Upper Room with Twelve Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary when they prayed for **nine days**.

**We will begin** our 9 Day Novena on Friday, November 29 @ 7:00 pm. Each night we will meet at a different house for the devotion. Schedules are available in the Church Hall. Please join us as a community.

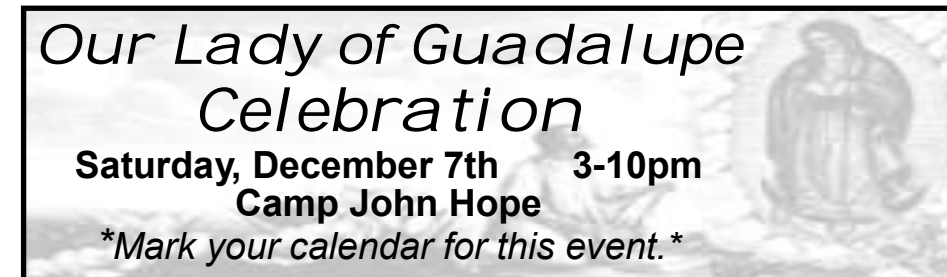


**Diocesan Compliance**
