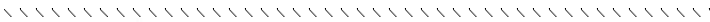

We will be ending Eucharistic Adoration at 6:00 PM on Wednesdays. Our Family Faith Formation Program will be in the church on Wednesday evenings.

As part of the celebration of the its 75th anniversary, the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Bismarck will have a 40 Hours Devotion on November 20, 21, and 22, a special 40-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. Of course, the focus of this devotion is on the Holy Eucharist. It gives us time to deepen our appreciation of the importance of the mystery of the Eucharist in our lives. The event includes Eucharistic Adoration in the main church, Masses, confessions, and Fr. Brian Gross will lead a parish mission with a series of homilies on the Eucharist. All are welcome to attend as much of the 40 Hours as their schedule permits. Adoration during this event is open to everyone in the Diocese of Bismarck. 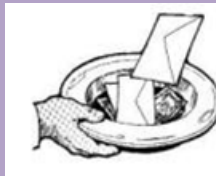
