

## Suggested Weekly Learning Goals November

| <b>Weekly Teaching for Parents</b> |   |
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| Week 1                             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ <b>Introduce Words to Know:</b> Parent's discuss <b>words to know</b> with their children on Parent Guide pages 50 and 63. Teach their children what the words mean.</li> <li>❑ <b>Understand Words to Know:</b> By the end of the week, the children should know how to <b>explain and define the words to know</b>.</li> <li>❑ <b>Get to know Old Testament Patriarchs.</b> Parents and children should read the brief biography of the Old Testament Patriarchs on Parent's Guide pages 64-65</li> <li>❑ <b>Learn Scripture Verse:</b> Begin reciting daily the <b>Scripture verse for the month.</b> <i>"God created mankind in His image; in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them."</i></li> </ul>   |
| Week 2                             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ <b>Parent and Child Activities:</b> Parents should choose one or more activities to teach Made in His image, Body and Soul, what is Grace, fall from grace, and, fallen but loved by God in Parent's Guide pages 51-61, and lead the children through this activity.</li> <li>❑ <b>Learning Goal for the Week:</b> Children should be able to answer the question of what it means to be made in God's image and likeness, how do we know that God loves us which we know because God created us and promised to save us from our sins.</li> </ul>   |
| Week 3                             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ <b>Parent and Child Activities:</b> Parents should choose one or more activity on Covenants in Scripture in Parent's Guide on pages 64-70 to teach their children.</li> <li>❑ <b>Learning Goals for the Week:</b> Children should be able to answer the questions of How God has revealed Himself in Salvation History. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ The children should learn how God has entered into covenants with His people. A covenant is a solemn promise that establishes a family relationship.</li> <li>❑ God established a covenant with Adam and Eve that was a covenant of a holy couple, the sign of this covenant was marriage,</li> <li>❑ God entered into a covenant with Noah that established a covenant of a holy family, the sign of this covenant was a rainbow.</li> <li>❑ God entered into a covenant with Abraham that was a covenant of a holy tribe, God made three promises to Abraham a land (nation) a name (dynasty) and a worldwide blessing, the sign of this covenant was circumcision</li> <li>❑ God entered into a covenant with Moses of a holy nation, the sign of this covenant was the law, God entered into a covenant with David of a Kingdom, the sign of this covenant was the temple.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |

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|        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>❑ All of these covenants prepared for the New and Everlasting Covenant that God established with all mankind by the Incarnation, Death and Resurrection of His Son.</li><br/><li>❑ Explain that a type is something or someone in the Old Testament that foreshadows someone or something in the New Testament. Isaac is a type of Jesus Christ. This is demonstrated in the Libro De Actividades Pages 112-113 or in the English activity book page 59.</li><br/><li>❑ <b>Your Catholic Home:</b> Scripture reading and Lectio Divina. Every day the family should gather together and spend 5 to 10 minutes reading the Scriptures, the Bible. You should also develop the habit of Lectio Divina which entails choosing a passage from the Gospel reading it aloud, then the family should spend a few minutes in silence thinking about the passages that was read and what word or phrase of what may have remained your thoughts then the family should share some of the words and phrases they dwelt on in their thoughts, after this one of the older children should read the passage from Scripture again and the family should spend a few more minutes in silence thinking about what the Lord is asking each of you to do through His word and end by praying the Our Father.</li><br/><li>❑ <b>Explanation and Preparation for Advent:</b> Parents should explain that the season of Advent is a time for preparing and waiting for the coming of Jesus at Christmas and at the end of the world. The family should consider ways of growing in their faithfulness to God during this season by reflecting on God's love for their family by His faithfulness to the promises He has made to us.</li></ul> |
