Inaugural Mass for St. Francis de Sales Catholic Radio Station KFDS-LP

The first live broadcast of Holy Mass was celebrated by Bishop Liam Cary Sunday, April 10th at St. Francis of Assisi Historic Church in Bend. Bishop Cary provided special prayers and a blessing for our new Catholic Radio Station KFDS-LP (93.5 FM). In his opening remarks, Bishop Cary acknowledged and welcomed all those who were listening throughout Bend. "This is a historic moment for the Diocese of Baker," says Barry Metzentine (Director of Evangelization and Catechesis), "the first diocesan owned radio station and the first live broadcast of Holy Mass. It is fitting that our first local broadcast is with Bishop Cary celebrating Mass and providing his pontifical blessing on the radio station — a kind of grand opening if you will."

Under the direction of Bishop Cary, a radio advisory board is being established to explore and recommend local and diocesan programing. Examples being considered include: live broadcasts of the daily and Sunday Masses at St. Francis of Assisi Historic Church for the benefit of the homebound, regularly scheduled prerecorded prayers (e.g. Rosary, Angelus, etc.), promotion of Catholic schools, and announcements for local and diocesan events. Currently the radio station is maintained by a small team of volunteers. Our ability to expand local broadcast content and programs is dependent upon donations to the annual Bishop's Appeal and direct contributions to the radio station. If you would like

Bishop Liam Cary to Ordain Seminarian Victor Mena to the Transitional Diaconate



Bishop Liam Cary and the Mena Family of Mexico City invite you to attend the Ordination to the Diaconate of Victor Mena at St. Pius X Church in Klamath Falls on Thursday, May 26, 2016, at 7:00 PM.

Over the course of time, the Order of Deacon in the Latin Church evolved from

a permanent state into a transitional period prior to ordination to the Priesthood, hence the distinction between a permanent deacon and a transitional deacon. The Second Vatican Council restored the permanent diaconate.

Ordination as a *transitional deacon* occurs in the final stages of theological studies and is the last major step before ordination to the priesthood, which usually follows within a year. Diaconate ordination usually takes place where the new deacon will serve for a short time before being ordained to the priesthood. Victor's formal title after May 26 will be "Reverend Mister" because he is in formal transition to priestly ordination. During the ordination rite, Victor's brother deacons will welcome him into their number.

Transitional Deacons are given authority to baptize, to witness marriages, and to preach the Gospel. Unlike a priest, deacons cannot absolve sins, offer Mass, or consecrate the Holy Eucharist, administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, or administer the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Good and Faithful Servants

The phone rang at my home in Eugene. It was March 2012. "Father Liam speaking," I answered. "Hello, Bishop," said the voice on the other end. "This is Peggy Buselli in Bend."

"Bishop"? It startled me to hear myself called by this title. Only days before I had been told, in greatest secrecy, of the Pope's decision to name me Bishop of Baker. It would be weeks before anyone who knew me would hear about this out-of-the-blue change of life. Everyone still called me "Father Liam."



But Peggy Buselli didn't. She knew what was in the works. She had to. It was her job to get the new bishop ordained, installed, and up to speed.

I would be the fourth Bishop of Baker Peggy worked for. Bishop Connolly hired her in January 1999 to help with administration, religious education, and youth ministry, and then called on her talents in bookkeeping and clergy support. These multiple, wideranging responsibilities extended Peggy's reach far beyond Bend, into virtually every parish in the Diocese. She learned how things worked—and who made them work. Parish staff members and parish priests as well as priests and lay people in the Diocesan Office found her receptive to their questions and wise in her responses. To priests from abroad (and Sisters from Kenya) Peggy devoted especially kind and careful attention all the way alongbefore they arrived, throughout their complex immigration process, and during their period of adjustment. From the deep well of her cheerfulness Peggy drew forth consistently sound and well-balanced advice for those she served so selflessly as executive secretary: Bishops Vasa, Skylstad, and me. Little did I know that day in March when Peggy called that the Lord had put me in the best of hands.

Now, after 17 years, those hands are laying down their burden. Peggy and Ray have bought a home in Florida and will be moving there this spring. Those of us who had the joy of working daily with Peggy will be grateful to God for her as long as the sun comes up in the sky.

To take Peggy's place we stole Leah Bickett from St. Pius X Parish in Klamath Falls, and the children she has been preparing for First Holy Communion there do not approve of her move! They are the latest of many she has helped along in her 15 years as a Religious Education



teacher at St. Pius, where she sings in the choir as well. Leah graduated from Oregon State with a degree in Business Administration and Accounting. For the last 12 years she has been the Accountant and Accounting Supervisor for the Klamath County School District. There she acquired skills that will

serve her well in her new task of keeping the Bishop accountable! We are most happy to have Leah with us at the Diocesan Office.

El teléfono sonó en mi casa en Eugene. Era Marzo del 2012. "Habla el Padre Liam", contesté. "Hola, Señor Obispo", dijo la voz en el otro extremo. "Esta es Peggy Busselli en Bend".

"Señor Obispo"? me sobresalté al oirme llamado por ese título. Solo unos días antes se me había informado, en el mayor secreto, de la decisión del Papa de nombrarme Obispo de Baker. Serían semanas antes de que alguien que me conociera escucharía sobre este cambio de vida. Todos todavía me llamaban "Padre Liam".

Pero no Peggy Busselli. Ella conocía lo que se estaba trabajando. Ella tenía que saberlo. Era su trabajo que el nuevo obispo se ordenara, instalara y fuera puesto al tanto.

Yo seria el cuarto Obispo de Baker para el que Peggy trabajara. El Obispo Connolly la contrató en Enero de 1999 para ayudar con la administración, educación religiosa, y ministerio de jóvenes, y después llamó en sus talentos de contabilidad y apoyo del clero. Estas responsabilidades múltiples y de amplio alcance extendieron el alcance de Peggy mucho más allá de Bend, en prácticamente cada parroquia de la Diócesis. Ella aprendió como trabajaban las cosas—y quién las hacía trabajar. menor idea que ese día en Marzo cuando Peggy me llamó, que el Señor me había puesto en las mejores manos posibles.

Ahora, después de 17 años, esas manos están dejando a un lado su carga. Peggy y Ray han comprado una casa en Florida y se estarán moviendo esta primavera. Aquellos de nosotros que tuvimos el placer de trabajar diariamente con Peggy estaremos agradecidos con Dios por ella siempre que el sol aparezca en el cielo.

Para tomar el lugar de Peggy, nos robamos a Leah Bickett de la Parroquia de San Pío X en Klamath Falls, jy los niños que ella ha estado preparando para la Primera Comunión no aprueban de su movida! Ellos son los últimos de muchos que ella ha ayudado en sus 15 años como maestra de Educación Religiosa en San Pío, donde ella también canta en el coro. Leah se graduó de la Universidad del Estado de Oregon con un título en Administración de Empresas y Contabilidad. Por los últimos 12 años, ella ha sido la Contadora y Supervisora de Contabilidad para el Distrito Escolar del Condado de Klamath. Ahí ella adquirió habilidades que le servirán bien en su nueva tarea de ¡mantener al corriente al Obispo! Estamos muy contentos de tener a Leah con nosotros en la Oficina Diocesana.



The Extraordinary Form (Latin) Mass is offered every other weekend at St. Francis of Assisi Historic Church at 1:00 p.m.




