ALL SAINTS: We begin November by honoring all saints of every age, and near the end of November the liturgical year culminates in the celebration of Christ the King. In worldly terms, Jesus, a carpenter from Nazareth, did not resemble a king; but people quickly noticed that he spoke with authority. And he went among the sick and the poor, and said to his disciples, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them ...But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you shall be your servant". (Matthew 20:25-26). Saints of November show us what it looks like to participate in the new and true kingship of Jesus. Saint Charles Borromeo of Milan visited the sick in their homes and hospitals at a time of plague, and devoted himself to prayer and penance on behalf of his suffering people. Saint Elizabeth, a princess of Hungary, established a hospital and performed many works in service of the poor. Saint Frances Cabrini, the first canonized U.S. citizen, worked among poor immigrants, establishing orphanages, schools, and hospitals. In every age and through many difficulties, Christ the King extends his Kingdom by calling disciples - living sacraments - who place themselves at the service of the poor and suffering. They may not look to the world like royalty, but they bear a mysterious and profound authority, witnessing to a Kingdom which is visible in the midst of the world., and yet not of this world.

NOVEMBER 1 ALL SAINTS Solemnity

Readings: Rv 7:2-4, 9-14/1 Jn 3:1-3/Mt 5:1-12a

I used to hand out buttons on All Hallows Eve that simply said "I hope to be one someday" with a halo around the I. Getting a button would confuse a lot of kids, but it also opened the door to speaking about what this feast it all about. We are all called to holiness, to become Saints. The readings of this feast point to that effect, that we gather with that cloud of witnesses, saints both canonized and recognized, as well as those saints who may be unknown to us, but still standing with all the saints in glory.

Our gospel reading for this feast are the beatitudes, which speak to us about who are the blessed in God's eyes: the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek and those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemakers and those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness. The beatitudes also speak to us about the fact that, although the Kingdom of God is among us, it is not yet fully realized. We are living in the ends of time and are called to pray and work for the fulfillment of time, where Jesus is Lord of all. This All Saints Day, peak people's curiosity and invite them to become saints!
