THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Readings: Wis 6:12-16/1 Thes 4:13-18 or 4:13-14/Mt 25:1-13

I used to think of the wise virgins with extra oil as being selfish. Isn't sharing of our wealth a good thing? Yet if the lamp symbolizes faith, then the oils symbolizes those things that feed our faith: living the virtues, good deeds, right worship. These are not things that you can buy from a dealer or give to someone else. These are things that we must integrate into our lives over a lifetime of practicing and deepening our faith. A life of faith in Christ is not something superficial that we can simply put on for a celebration, it is rather a long term relationship with Jesus, allowing him into our lives daily, so that we may enter into the feast.

NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF ALL SOULS: LTP

Sourcebook "It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins," observes the writer of Maccabees in the Old Testament (2 Maccabees 12:45-46; quoted in Catechism of the Catholic Church, 958). Intercession on behalf of those who have died is a cherished tenet of our Catholic faith, springing from our belief in the resurrection of the body and the communion of the saints. "Though separated from the living, the dead are still at one with the community of believers on earth and benefit from their prayer and intercession" (Order of Christian Funerals, 6). Trusting in God's mercy, we continue to pray for them, knowing that this spiritual bond with our brothers and sisters who have died can never be broken. In the month of November, when we celebrate All Souls, we pray in a special way for those who have died-those who are known to us, and those who are unknown.

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time -- Let us pray that the Word of Life will make progress. Let us pray for an increase in vocations to priesthood and religious life.
