# 26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY UPDATE

"That our parish community be enlivened by the Holy Spirit to preach the gospel in bold new ways, we pray to the Lord."

At every Sunday liturgy we have been praying this prayer in our Universal Prayers. It is a result of Bishop Fabbro's

announcement that we are observing a special Year of Prayer for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on our diocese as we seek to be "a mission-orientated Church that forms disciples of Jesus". What bold new ways? Why are we mission-orientated? How do we form disciples? For me, it has been a call to evaluate all that I do so I want to share with you our parish's Youth & Family Ministry evaluation and where we are headed.

In January 2006 we gathered a number of parishioners to form a Youth Advisory Board. Our mission was to "provide opportunities for all youth to learn about and enter into a relationship with God in their lives, foster a relationship between the youth and the parish and continue to support and advocate for our youth as they continue their faith journey." Over the next seven years we continued to meet, survey, and discern what opportunities to provide to foster those relationships. It was clear to us that the million dollar question was how we engage parents in faith formation and/or mass attendance. In January of 2014 our parish announced that Youth Ministry had taken on a mantle of family ministry, meaning that we will intentionally minister to the entire family through various programs and retreats, in the schools and sacramental preparation.

Fast forward to May 2019, and to Bishop Fabbro's announcement to be a mission-orientated Church that forms disciples of Jesus. The greatest formatter of disciples was Jesus – we see it over and over in the New Testament. The disciples journeyed with Him throughout His ministry and they grew in their relationship to know God, love God and serve God. Their journey was not easy; often they travelled to the people rather than expect the people to come to them. So we must too. So our parish is being intentional in engaging youth and their families to know God, love God and serve God, through our parish programs at the parish and in our schools and community.

We are boldly going into mission territory, our schools, where our youth are gathered with a new initiative with our Sacred Noon Hour twice a month. Young people are encouraged to know, love and serve God through song, prayers of the Saints and works of mercy.

We continue to celebrate liturgies, Eucharistic Adoration and Reconciliation with our school communities. We continue to form disciples through Altar Serving, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and our High School Ministry. Families continue to know, love and serve God in our Birthday Card Program, Family Catechism and in our preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation.

Being bold (defined as not hesitating or fearful in the face of actual or possible danger or rebuff; courageous and daring) is not easy. Sometimes it means letting go of events or programs to make way for something new. What do you need to let go of to be bold in your discipleship? Thanks be to God He sent us the Holy Spirit! Come Holy Spirit – fill the hearts of your people with the desire to boldly go out and make disciples!

#### **SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS**

Our Sunday school program happens during the 9 am Mass Sunday mornings. Sunday School is a program for children who are age 3 (or toilet trained) until they enter grade 2 to help them learn the rituals of Mass and hear the Gospel story in child friendly language, through craft and song. Father John, at the beginning of Mass, calls the children forward and they process to the Parish Centre with their leader and return to you during the offertory song.
