### Immigration Updates

Recently, the Trump Administration has made some changes in its immigration enforcement practices, including separating families at the border - holding children in separate detention facilities from their mothers and fathers. They have also revised the asylum criteria to exclude domestic violence.

Cardinal DiNardo, the head of the US Bishops Conference, issued the following statement at the meeting of all the US Bishops last week. His remarks to the bishops were greeted by a standing ovation.

"At its core, asylum is an instrument to preserve the right to life. The Attorney General's recent decision elicits deep concern because it potentially strips asylum from many women who lack adequate protection. These vulnerable women will now face return to the extreme dangers of domestic violence in their home country. This decision negates decades of precedents that have provided protection to women fleeing domestic violence. Unless overturned, the decision will erode the capacity of asylum to save lives, particularly in cases that involve asylum seekers who are persecuted by private actors. We urge courts and policy makers to respect and enhance, not erode, the potential of our asylum system to preserve and protect the right to life.

Additionally, I join Bishop Joe Vásquez, Chairman of USCCB's Committee on Migration, in condemning the continued use of family separation at the U.S./Mexico border as an implementation of the Administration's zero tolerance policy. Our government has the discretion in our laws to ensure that young children are not separated from their parents and exposed to irreparable harm and trauma. Families are the foundational element of our society and they must be able to stay together. While protecting our borders is important, we can and must do better as a government, and as a society, to find other ways to ensure that safety. Separating babies from their mothers is not the answer and is immoral."


Families are the bedrock of every society. As families disintegrate, so do societies. It is in our families that we learn what it means to be a son or a daughter. It is there that we experience love and are affirmed. It is there that we form the secure attachment we need in order to grow up to connect well with others. In our families, we experience the love of God in and through our parents, as husbands and wives help one another on the way to Heaven. Or at least, that is what families should be, that is what God created them to be. Unfortunately, we live in an imperfect world, and as we see from the beginning with that Original Fall, Satan has a particular hatred for the family and seeks to divide, to strike at this important part of God's plan for us, of God's gift to us. The traumas inflicted in childhood shape us, and can impact our lives in countless unseen or unacknowledged ways. While we can have disagreements over immigration policies and practices, and while there is room for debate over some things, a policy of separating children from parents can not be one of them. It would be one thing if the government did so to protect children from dangerous parents or situations, as we see with the sad cases when CPS is involved. But that isn't the case here. This new policy is not good for the children, nor for the parents, nor does it serve any governmental interest. Government is supposed to exist to serve families, not rip them apart. Our broken immigration system is breaking far too many people.

This past Fall, Pope Francis invited the Church around the world to Share the Journey with one another. It is an international effort to recognize the human face of those who are often only listed as statistics, whose names are hidden behind labels. As you read these words from the comfort of your home, or in the church before Mass, or at Coffee and Donuts or on the car ride home, in a place of relative comfort and ease, there are hundreds of millions of people around the world who are experiencing extreme poverty, the ravages of violence and war in their homelands and communities and in their families, persecution as a racial or religious minority, or countless other traumas. Some choose to flee in what can be a terrifying experience in itself, to migrate. People who do so should not experience further trauma by having their families torn apart—especially children who long ago lost their innocence, and which is now compounded by being taken from their parents, often without being allowed to say goodbye or told if they will see them again.

New for 2018-19, we will be bulk buying school supplies and passing on the savings to parents. Costs for school supplies per student is dependent on grade and will be communicated in August.


