The Journey of Faith with The Carmelite Sisters of our Lady

On Friday, July 16th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, our Sisters will celebrate their feast day. We are blessed by their presence in our midst, by the many ways in which they point us and help us towards Heaven.

In 1981, two Filipina Carmelite Sisters from their American-based congregation were deeply inspired to continue their teaching ministry in the Diocese of Dumaguete, Philippines. They discerned that a congregation focused on Christian formation and education would best serve the need of the diocese. With the support of Bishop Epifanio B. Surban, they established the Carmelite Sisters of Our Lady on February 11, 1982.

The Carmelite Sisters of Our Lady arrived in Seattle from the Philippines in 1991. Sr. Mary Rose Deloria was the first to arrive, joined three years later by Sr. Baybeth Marie Andaya. In 2001 and 2002, four more sisters would arrive. There have been nine sisters altogether who have ministered here for a combined total of 112 years of service.

There are currently four sisters in the community living in West Seattle, three in Vancouver, BC, with the remaining 45+ in the Philippines.

Sr. FilAme is the local superior and works at the Intergenerational Learning Center at the Mount. Sr. Juanita works at our school as a classroom aide and religion teacher. Sr. Christine is a chaplain at St. Joseph Residence, the retirement home for sisters attached to the Mount. And Sr. Stella assists at our parish with Sacramental Preparation for our second graders and other children and youth seeking to enter the church.



The Carmelites have been a great blessing to our local community in West Seattle these past forty years! And they are just a few years away from paying off the mortgage on their convent, a sign of their ongoing commitment to be missionaries in our midst. While normally they have a big celebration at their home for their feast day with everyone welcome, that is unfortunately not possible this year. However, please be sure to share your appreciation in the days ahead as they celebrate their community feast day this week.

Carrying the Presence of Christ Into the World

As we come to the end of our Year of the Eucharist in the Archdiocese of Seattle and enter a new phase of our pastoral planning process, I'd like to offer a brief reflection on the Eucharist — the privileged place of encounter with Jesus that empowers us to carry out his mission.

Our Church is built upon the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. On the solemnity of Corpus Christi, we renew our faith in this mysterious but true presence of Christ in the eucharistic elements of bread and wine, which become his body and blood. It is this presence of Christ in the Church and all its members that makes the Church at once divine and human.

To be all we are called to be as members of the Body of Christ, it is imperative that we celebrate well and regularly receive the Eucharist.

I know there are many things in this world competing for our time and attention — and the pandemic has created yet more obstacles — but for us to be fully Catholic members of this one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, we must grow in our understanding of the importance of regular reception of the Eucharist. It is the one thing Christ asked us to do for him: “Do this in memory of me.”

A deeper appreciation for the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is significant not only for the moment of celebrating Eucharist, but also for the great impact it is meant to have in transforming and redeeming individuals and the world in which we live. We are sent forth from every Eucharist to love and serve the Lord and

one another. The Eucharist (and the Church) is Christ's chosen means of remaining with us until the end of time. As we receive Christ into our bodies, he is continuing the work of redemption, conforming us more and more to his truth, and transforming our priorities to the priorities of the Kingdom.

We are to carry this same presence and person of Christ with us into the world and be authentic witnesses to the reality of his death and resurrection and his promise to come again. This is the process by which the world is conformed, transformed, converted into the Kingdom of God which has yet to come in all its fullness. How do I allow this presence of Christ in me to “speak” in moments of trial and temptation? How do I bring this presence of Christ in me to others?

As Christ poured himself out for our sake, so are we to give fully of ourselves to others. To do so is to empty oneself, and this gift of self (which is the gift of Christ) can only be “refilled” by renewing his life within us at the eucharistic feast. Thus, we see the unending cycle of life in our daily Christian life: dying to self, rising in Christ that the work and will of the Father might be fulfilled. This is our belief, that through the ordinary events of our daily life, the extraordinary work of Christ continues until the end of time, when he will return to make all things new.

ARE YOU EXPERIENCING COMPASSION FATIGUE?

Compassion Fatigue is a term used to describe the psychological, emotional, and physical cost of working in one of the helping professions, such as healthcare, education, mental health, disaster relief, law enforcement, hospice care, and social and environmental justice. The individuals involved in these and other similar professions pay a high emotional price because trauma can be contagious – especially for the highly empathetic, who are likely to choose professions where they will be always reaching out a hand to help others.

The impact of absorbing secondary trauma can affect both the professional and personal life and alter world view. The good news is there are healthy ways to combat this onslaught and to build positive defenses against secondary trauma.
