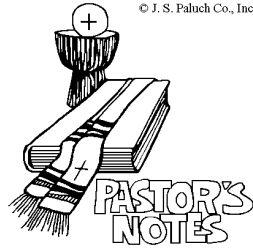

Pastor's Note

March 24, 2019
Third Sunday of Lent

“Under Construction,
Spiritual Renovation.”



This weekend we celebrate the Third Sunday of Lent. The readings today focus on forgiveness, conversion and patience. In the First Reading from the book of Exodus, we read how the Lord appears to Moses in a burning bush and calls him to shepherd the people of Israel out of Egypt. In the Gospel of Luke, we read how Jesus urges the people to repent by teaching the “Parable of the fig tree.” This Gospel is often called the “the gospel of second chance.” Like the merciful and compassionate gardener, God continues to see our worth and calls forth that goodness that is within each one of us. God’s love is constant and unconditional. Repentance is a major theme running through Luke’s gospel. Forgiveness requires repentance. We are half way through Lent. Let us use this time for conversion and preparation of renewal of baptismal promises at Easter.

This coming Tuesday we welcome Bishop David Zubik to the Catholic Community of the East End as we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for Forty-Five of our Eighth Graders!

Pittsburgh East Regional Catholic Elementary Schools

As announced last week in the Pittsburgh Catholic newspaper and in our bulletin, the Diocese has named a new board of directors to lead the Pittsburgh East Regional Catholic Elementary Schools (which will include St. Bede School). Representing each of the parish groupings, the fifteen person board will eventually become a governing body providing oversight of elementary schools in the East Region. James Maher Jr. will be representing our grouping.

Please note that Sister Thea Bowman Catholic Academy in Wilkesburg along with St. Benedict the Moor School in the Hill District and North Side Catholic Assumption Academy in Brighton Heights will form their own Regional Board and have a Regional Director starting in July since they are Extra Mile Foundation funded schools.

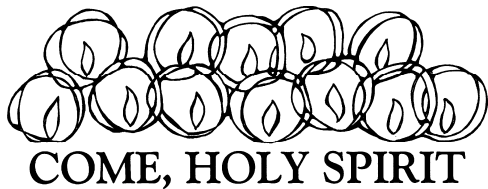

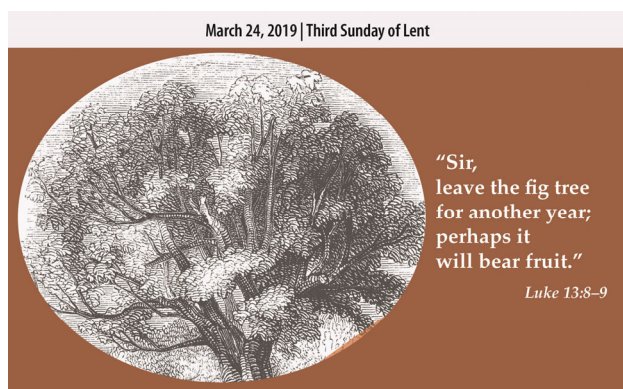

ON MISSION FOR THE CHURCH ALIVE! I MUST GO OVER to LOOK at THIS REMARKABLE SIGHT

In today's first reading, Moses, while tending the flocks of his father-in-law, happens upon a bush which is burning, but which is not consumed. Moses' reaction is to "go over to look at this remarkable sight, which he does. However, the Lord, in speaking from the burning bush, wants him to do more than look. Instead, God reveals himself to Moses and calls Moses to lead His people out of slavery in Egypt. While Moses has some reservations, he says yes to God and works to lead his people to freedom. Like Moses, the Lord wants us to do more than look at Him or at His Church. The Lord wants us to be engaged with Him. Faith is not a passive endeavor. Faith is an active engagement with God in the community of the Church. It is easy to look at the Church and say, "I like this" or, "I do not like that" and then do nothing about it. It takes effort to get involved to be an instrument of Jesus' life in the Church. As we continue our Lenten journey may we be renewed not only to see God better, but to embrace most fully his will.
