**Feast Day of St. James**

**Entrance: Table of Plenty** (Schutte) (St. Mary Magdalene Favorites book)

**Refrain:** *Come to the feast of heaven and earth! Come to the table of plenty!  
God will provide for all that we need, here at the table of plenty.*

1.O come and sit at my table where saints and sinners are friends.  
I wait to welcome the lost and lonely to share the cup of my love. **(to Refrain)**

**Refrain:** *The hand of the Lord feed us; he answers all our needs; he answers all our needs.*

**Offertory: Two Fisherman** (Toolen) Red Worship Hymnal #633

Two fishermen who lived along the Sea of Galilee,  
Stood by the shore to cast their nets into an ageless sea.  
Now Jesus watched them from afar then called them each by name:  
It changed their lives, these simple men; they'd never be the same.  
*Leave all things you have and come and follow me, and come and follow me.*

And as he walked along the shore 'twas James and John he'd find,  
And these two sons of Zebedee would leave their boats behind.

2. Many the gifts, many the works, one in the Lord of all. **(to Refrain)**
3. Grain for the fields, scattered and grown, gathered to one for all. **(to Refrain)**

**Communion Meditation: Bread and Fishes** (Bell) Duet

**Refrain:** *We've the wind in the willows, and the birds in the sky,  
We've a bright sun to warm us, wherever we lie.  
We have bread and fishes and a jug of red wine  
To share on our journey with all of mankind.*

**Recessional: Lord of the Dance** (Shaker Song, text Carter) Blue Gather Hymnal #297 (v.1,2,5)

1. I danced in the morning when the world was begun,  
and I danced in the moon and the stars and the sun.  
And I came down from heaven and I danced on the earth;  
At Bethlehem I had my birth.

**Refrain:** *Dance then wherever you may be; I am the Lord of the Dance, said he,
