Assignment #1: About Theme

Choose one book from **BOOK LIST 1** and write an essay on the book's theme. **The *theme* is the main idea of the book and usually talks about a serious subject. I must be a STATEMENT, not just one word.**

1. Your first paragraph should state and explain a theme of the book.
2. Your second and third paragraphs should use specific examples from the book that show the theme you have chosen.
3. Include at least ONE quote (correctly cited) in each paragraph to support the theme you are writing about.

Assignment #2: REQUIRED NONFICTION BOOK

Choose one book from **BOOK LIST 2**. Write an essay in which you respond to the historical context (time period) of the book. What issue (problem) in history does the book discuss? In your response, write about how the character(s) handle the situation they are in.

1. Your first paragraph should talk about the **time period**. What is happening in history? Be as specific as possible when describing the time period.
2. Your second paragraph should talk about how the time period and what is happening affects the **world**.
3. Your third paragraph should talk about how the time period and what is happening affects an **individual person**.
4. Include at least ONE quote in each paragraph.
