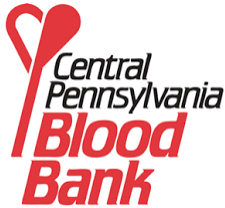

7th Annual Christmas Fest

My name is Valerie Spangler and I have been a parishioner of Saint Joseph Catholic Church for 25 years. I am the coordinator for **Christmas Fest**, an annual parish and community event that brings God's people together to enjoy a day of holiday fun and fellowship.

Christmas Fest originated as an idea proposed by the Columbiettes and the Knights of Columbus in the spring of 2013 and approved by the late Father Louis Ogden who also viewed Christmas Fest as an opportunity for parish ministries and Saint Joseph School to come together for this one-day event.

Christmas Fest is held the Saturday before Thanksgiving from 8:00 AM until 3:30 PM in the Parish Life and Education Center. The date for this year's Christmas Fest is Saturday, November 23. Planning meetings are held monthly beginning in June and ending with a wrap up meeting in early December.

This year's Christmas Fest will feature 60 craft vendors, children's games, silent auction, scholastic book sale, raffle, bake sale, and a very special visit by Saint Nicholas. Breakfast and lunch will also be available as well as musical performances by Saint Joseph School and Trinity High School students.

CAREGIVERS - Day of Prayer and Care
