2. Send a note in with your child

3. If you wish to set up a phone or zoom call, please send an email to schedule one.

1. Please send your scholar to school with 2 masks per day. Make sure they are aware where their spare one is stored. Please reiterate to your child that masks should not be shared.
2. Remind your child that they need to keep it on all day with the exception of our hourly mask break and while eating lunch or snack.
3. Keep your child home if they feel or are sick.
4. Please log into your student's Google account and join my Google Classroom prior to the first day of school. Everyone should have already received a request. I encourage you to sign up to be a guardian
5. Your student's email address and password is the same as last year. The password should be **btrcs2027**.
6. If you haven't already, please consider clearing out all files in your scholars google drive. This will ensure only items for this academic year are available.

7. Please download the Remind App and join our page. Please **text @btrcs2-6 to 81010**. Our class name is Miss Kudlick - 2nd Grade.
8. Please follow the email you should have received from Ms. Milewski in reference to the first day of school.
 - a. Cohort A in person Tuesday/Thursday 9/8 and 9/10
7:30 am til 1 pm (No remote learning Wednesday/Friday)
 - b. Cohort B in person Wednesday/Friday 09/09 and 9/11
7:30 am til 1 pm (No remote learning Tuesday/Thursday)
 - c. Remote learners must log in on Tuesday/Thursday 9/8 and 9/10
Must login by 8:15am (No remote learning Wednesday/Friday)

You will need to click the Google Meet link to log in. This is the last line in the green banner with the little camera on our Google Classroom page.

9. Please refer to the Opening of School Procedures document attached to the email received when you were notified of your scholars cohort. This will outline the procedures on entering the building. If your student walks or is dropped off, they should enter through the map doors.
10. Please send your student with **2 snacks** the first week of school as hot lunch **WILL NOT** be served
11. Please send your student with a bottle of water (**no thermos' or reusable water bottles are allowed**). All water fountains on campus have been turned off.
12. Please send in your student's stationary fee ASAP so students have the necessary tools for learning. Please send the \$15 fee in an envelope with your scholars' name. Materials will not be distributed until the stationary fee has been paid.
13. **Fully Virtual Students:** Books and supplies can be picked up on Thursday, September 10, 2020 from 5 pm til 6:30 pm. Look out for a school communication with further details. Please have your scholars stationary fee at this time. If you do not have the fee, they **WILL NOT** receive the stationary items purchased through the school. This fee is \$15.00.
14. I will send all excess school supplies home with your scholar as there is no where to store them nor are we allowed to share. Please ensure your child has the following items daily:
 - a. 3 sharpened pencils, eraser, red pen, glue stick, crayons, and scissors

15. **Art Supplies:** Additional supplies were requested for art since we can not share. They are as follows: crayons, color pencils, and 2 pencils. Please place it in a plastic art box, labeled, as they will stay in school for art. (the rectangle plastic school boxes \$1)
16. Each scholar will have a number line and tens frame for home use to assist with math.

We can always use hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes if you would like to send any extras in throughout the year.

I hope this answers any questions you may have. The only way our students will succeed is if we work together with their best educational interest in mind.
