From the Desk of Father Tim Sandquist

Dear parishioners of Nativity and Immaculate Conception,

Thank you for your warm welcome to me so far! It's been a wonderful three weeks getting acclimated to the parishes. I look forward to continuing to get to know all of you as time goes on. One thing that can help with this, of course, is to let you know a bit more about me. So this week, I'd like to share with you how I wound up as a priest.

After I graduated from high school, my plan was to become a mechanical engineer. I was inspired in this direction largely because of a program I was a part of in high school called Supermileage. (In Supermileage we designed and built small one-person cars to compete for the highest gas mileage.) Though I am from Minnesota, I decided to go to South Dakota State University to pursue this. But it was during my freshman year at SDSU, when one of my classes required me to go to the engineering job fair, that I was set off in a much different direction.

What was significant for me about the job fair was that it provided me with an opportunity to take a pause, step back, and really think in a serious way about my future for the first time. At the job fair, while walking around and seeing all the company booths of potential future employers, one thing I noticed was a sense of unease within me. Perhaps I was feeling like a little fish in a big pond, or perhaps I was also feeling like engineering didn't quite seem as glamorous as it had before, but whatever it was, I figured it would be a good idea to go back to my dorm room to just take some time to reflect on what I wanted to do with my life. When I did so, for one reason or another, the thought of the priesthood came into my mind, and as I thought about it, I began to be filled with excitement and joy. I thought to myself about how amazing and meaningful the life of a priest is - to be with people in their best and in their worst times, to bring people to God, and to help people get to heaven. Prior to this day, I had never considered priesthood as a serious option; I was too afraid of public speaking and I didn't want to give up marriage and a family. But in that moment, God gave me the grace of freedom to entrust these concerns to him.

A week or two later, I found out that the priest at the church near campus happened to be taking college students to visit St. John Vianney Seminary in St. Paul. I didn't know anything about seminary except that it was the place people go to in order to become priests, so I decided I better go along and find out more. A few months after that visit, I worked up the courage to contact the vocation director of the archdiocese to talk about my desire further and he set me up on a second visit to the seminary. After this visit, I finally felt ready to apply to the seminary for the next year, so I applied and was accepted.

The next three years of college seminary (undergraduate-level) was very good. I learned so much about the faith and about myself, but I felt I wasn't quite ready yet to go on to major seminary (graduate-level). The rector of the seminary agreed, so we decided that I would do one year of NET Ministries first. Through NET Ministries I travelled around the county with a team of twelve other young adults leading Catholic retreats for middle schoolers and high schoolers. I am so glad the rector of the seminary suggested this because I learned so much during this wonderful and challenging year.

After NET, I felt ready for major seminary, so I continued on. Although I never heard a voice from the clouds, during this four years of major seminary, I felt gradually more confident that God was calling me to the priesthood. I was finally ordained a deacon in 2016 and a priest in 2017.

It has been a great two years of priesthood so far, and I look forward to spending the next phase of it with you!
