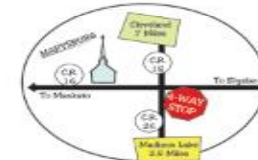

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick...

In my time as a priest, I have found that a lot of people have questions about the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. So, this week, I would like to answer a few of these questions.

-Is Anointing of the Sick found in the bible? Yes. Take a look here at the Letter of St. James: "Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven." (James 5:14-15).

-What does it do? The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick has several effects. "The first grace of this sacrament is one of strengthening, peace and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age." (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1520) However, in addition to this grace, the sacrament can also forgive sins. As the Catechism of St. Pius X says, this sacrament "remits venial sins, and also mortal sins which the sick person, if contrite, is unable to confess." As you can see, this makes this sacrament very valuable, even for those who are unconscious. This is one reason priest chaplains have often risked their lives in war to give this sacrament to the dying.

-Who is it for? The Code of Canon Law explains: "The anointing of the sick can be administered to a member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age" (#1004). In other words, it is for (1) the sick and (2) the elderly. But notice it also mentions that they must be in some sense "in danger." And so, this sacrament is not to be given trivially (e.g. for the common cold). In cases of doubt, however, the church teaches that the sacrament should be given (Code of Canon Law #1005).

-What about those going into surgery? It depends. The Church's Introduction to the Rite of Anointing of the Sick explains, "A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery." (paragraph #9). Notice here that it is not the surgery itself that is a reason to anoint someone, but the illness that is the reason for the surgery being needed in the first place. And so, if the illness is serious, then anointing is absolutely appropriate before surgery. On the other hand, if there is not a serious illness that is the reason for the surgery (e.g. wisdom teeth being removed), then anointing would not be appropriate. If someone is worried about the danger of such elective surgeries, but does not meet the criteria for anointing, the appropriate sacraments to seek are Confession and Holy Communion.

-When should it be requested? This sacrament is NOT only for those "on death's doorstep." The Second Vatican Council makes this clear: "Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Consequently, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the appropriate time to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived" (Sacrosanctum Concilium 73). For this reason, it is better to request it earlier than later.

-Can it be received more than once? Yes, the Code of Canon Law explains: "This sacrament can be repeated if the sick person, having recovered, again becomes gravely ill or if the condition becomes more grave during the same illness." (c. 1004)

-What is the difference between Anointing of the Sick and Last Rites? Last Rites is a more generic term that refers to someone receiving all of the prayers and sacraments appropriate for someone who is nearing death. This, of course, includes Anointing of the Sick, but it also includes other things like the sacrament of Confession (if the person is still able to confess), Holy Communion (called "Viaticum" when someone is dying), the Apostolic Pardon (a prayer that wipes away temporal punishment in purgatory), and other prayers and litanies.

-What should I do if I have a loved one who needs to be anointed? Call the parish office to request a priest. If it is an emergency outside of parish office hours, call the after-hours emergency phone listed in the bulletin (507-456-8473). Note: Many hospitals have priest chaplains on site or nearby that can also be requested.
