**Private vs. Public Revelation**

As you may be aware, St. Mary's will be hosting the International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Fatima on October 12th. This statue commemorates the appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary to three children in Fatima, Portugal in the year 1917. Since the Fatima apparitions fall into a category called private revelation, I figured a bulletin article on this topic might be worthwhile.

To explain what private revelations are, it is easiest to explain first what public revelation is. Public revelation, also called divine revelation, is God's revelation of himself to humanity as a whole. This kind of revelation comes to us through Scripture and Tradition. For example, when we listen to the Gospel at Mass on Sunday, we are listening to public revelation. It is something that we accept with supernatural faith, which is the kind of faith that unites us to God and saves us (e.g. "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life" - Jn 3:36).

Private revelations, on the other hand, are revelations given by God simply to help people live out their faith more fully. Examples of private revelations include miraculous visions, voices, etc. Unlike public revelation, private revelations are not assented to with supernatural faith, but only with human faith. Because of this, we are not strictly required to believe in any individual private revelation.

While it is true that private revelations are secondary to public revelation, private revelations are still valuable. One reason for this is that they can call us back to certain aspects of our faith that are more urgently needed or more neglected at our own time in history. For example, the message of the Blessed Mother at Fatima is primarily a call to prayer and conversion. This message doesn't add anything new to the gospel. Rather, it calls us to live the one true gospel more fully.

Private revelations are not simply to be accepted without scrutiny. St. Paul warns us that even Satan can disguise himself as an angel of light (2 Cor 11:14). This is why we must submit our own judgment to the Church when it comes to private revelations. Sometimes after an investigation the Church declares that a given apparition is "not of supernatural origin", while other times, like with Fatima, it is declared to be "worthy of belief."

Christians must never accept private "revelations" that claim to surpass or correct God's public revelation. This is because in sending us his Son, the very Word of God himself, God has spoken all to us. He has no other word. As the Catechism teaches, "no new public revelation is to be expected before the glorious manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ" (CCC #66).

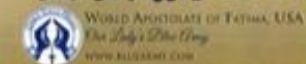
