For many people, a speeding ticket usually means a bit of embarrassment, a fine, or the inconvenience of appearing in court. But for those living in poverty, a speeding ticket can become a life-altering event.

In New Orleans, Donald lost his license years ago because he was caught speeding, could not pay the fine, and could not take off work to go to court. Contempt of court citations and unlicensed driving tickets quickly compounded the initial fine. Donald was losing hope that he could clear the backlog, get a better-paying job, and support his growing family while living right above the poverty level.

Thanks to your generosity to CCHD, the New Orleans Workers Center for Racial Justice (NOWCRJ) was able to provide Donald with the support he needed to change his situation. NOWCRJ hosted a clinic where Donald set up payment plans for his fines and got his license reinstated. Now Donald has a new job and has

been able to save money to move into his own apartment. NOWCRJ is also working with the judicial system to reduce backlogs, expunge records, and change how penalties are issued. With your contributions, our brothers and sisters across the country are breaking out of the cycle of poverty.

What Day is it?

Not long ago, I needed to say goodbye to a friend of mine who has been recently deployed to the Middle East. He is a member of the National Guard. Prior to his service as a member of the National Guard, he served our country in Marine Corps. It's amazing how real Veterans Day becomes to one who knows people who have served the in our country's Armed Forces.

Perhaps, I am asking an obvious question: what do we celebrate on Nov. 11th? Interestingly, over approximately the last 100 years, there has been a development to the answer to that question. Originally, Nov. 11th was called Armistice Day and was celebrated as such because on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month (11:00 am on Nov. 11th) there was an armistice (a cease fire) between the Germans and the Allies which many consider to essentially be the end of the "War to End All Wars", WWI. Therefore, as early as 1938, Nov. 11th was officially recognized as a public holiday to honor the veterans of WWI.

However, as time passed and the world experienced another devastating World War (WWII) and the Korean War, during the mid-1950s, Congress changed the title of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day in order to honor American Veterans of all wars.

Another interesting twist is that for a period of 7 years (1971-1978), Oct. 25th was established as the day on which our country was to celebrate Veterans Day. Nevertheless, even during the change in the laws regarding the date of this holiday, the general populace wanted to retain Nov. 11th as the official day of celebrating our country's veterans for obvious historical reasons (hence the return of the holiday to Nov. 11th in 1978).

Enough of the history lesson...it's clear, though, that this day has been one of great significance for our country for basically a century. Allow me to sincerely thank all veterans of our nation for their bravery to serve our country, to protect it from its enemies, and to help alleviate the sufferings of many peoples even across the globe. I thank in a special way all veterans and their families who are or who have been members of our parish communities throughout the decades. May God bless you all for your heroic sacrifice.

Most importantly, let us all await with eager hope the True Armistice Day, the Lord's Day, when at the end of time Jesus will establish a new heaven and a new earth (cf. Rev. 21:1) where there will be no more tears nor suffering (cf. Rev. 21:4), only peace. Come Lord Jesus, come O Divine King who will put an end to all war!
