Reflecting On Sunday's Readings

Pentecost Sunday — May 31, 2020

First Reading — Acts 2:1-11

¹ When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. ³ And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. ⁵ Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶ And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. ⁷ And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?" ⁸ And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹ Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹ Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

Second Reading — 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. ⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ... ¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body,

though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³
For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one
body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all
were made to drink of one Spirit

Gospel Reading — John 20:19-23

¹⁹ On the evening of that day, the first day of the
week, the doors being shut where the disciples
were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood
among them and said to them, “Peace be with
you.” ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them
his hands and his side. Then the disciples were
glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to
them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father
has sent me, even so I send you.” ²² And when
he had said this, he breathed on them, and said
to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive
the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the
sins of any, they are retained.”

INVITATION TO PRAY

INVITATION TO GROUP SHARING

First Reading — Acts 2:1-11

1. How was the filling of the Holy Spirit manifest?

Second Reading — 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

2. What are several ways in which we experience the Holy Spirit's presence?
3. How does the Spirit contribute to unity among believers?

Gospel Reading — John 20:19-23

4. Why was it necessary for Jesus to give the Holy Spirit?
5. What are the implications of, "As the Father has sent me, so send I you"?

INVITATION TO ACT

Determine a specific action (individual or group) that flows from your sharing. When choosing an individual action, determine what you will do and share it with the group. When choosing a group action, determine who will take responsibility for different aspects of the action. These should be your primary considerations.

CLOSING INVITATION TO PRAY

Give thanks to God (aloud or silently) for new insights, for desires awakened, for directions clarified, for the gift of one another's openness and sensitivity. Conclude with a final prayer.
