“The Lord Is Near”

My son, Xavier, was three years old when he disappeared at Whole Foods. For ten harrowing minutes, I ran down every aisle calling out Xavier’s name, and the supermarket staff blocked all the store’s exits. My heart raced. *Please God let me find him. Let him be in the store.* My prayers were quickly answered. Xavier was hiding underneath a display in the produce section. He was giggling as though we were playing a trivial game of hide-and-seek. I was so angry at this little boy but so thankful to God that He answered my prayers.

If you’re like me, crying out to Jesus in times of crisis and desperation is very easy. Sometimes, it’s harder to remember to communicate with God when life is placid and routine. St. Teresa of Avila, who encouraged people to pray at least 15 minutes a day, once lamented, “How often I failed in my duty to God, because I was not leaning on the strong pillar of prayer.” It’s comforting that even a great saint struggled with the call to pray, but like Saint Teresa of Avila, we are called to get back on the prayer wagon because it is a necessary foundation of our faith. God asks us to be in constant communication with Him, to “persevere in prayer” (*Romans 12:12*).

As someone very interested in health and fitness, I was pleased to learn that prayer was not only good for the soul but the body as well. Recent scientific studies showed that prayer not only had positive spiritual manifestations but it was also good for us physically. For example, *The American Journal of Psychiatry* released a study that showed prayer alleviates depression; *The Journal of Behavioral Medicine* stated that prayer increases people’s capacity for pain; and the *International Journal of Psychiatry in Medicine* found that senior citizens who prayed were less at risk for elevated blood pressure. However, it’s important not to view prayer as a mere technique to achieve physical health.

Prayer humbles people before God, and it reminds us of our dependence on Him. It tethers us to the Almighty, allowing us to seek His help when life goes awry, like when children are sick or when we’re between jobs. However, even when the storm passes, prayer is available to help us seek God’s guidance on life’s regular events and challenges: *How can I forgive someone who has hurt me repeatedly? Who and what should I vote for in the next election? Where should my family go on vacation? Should I continue my relationship with a particular person? Where should my children go to school?* Prayer is the means by which we involve God intimately in our daily lives. It is the vehicle that allows us to develop a relationship with Jesus, our Savior and friend. So let’s set aside at least 10 to 20 minutes daily to sit with Him in prayer because He “is near to all who call upon Him” (Psalm 145:18).

A Few Words About our Facilities

At the request of our Pastor, Fr. Andrew, the Buildings, Grounds and Safety Committee has been developing plans for the implementation many physical changes to our parish facility.

Currently the parish has engaged the services of an architect who will create the sets of plans required for permits from the City as well as for the approval our stakeholders and the Diocese. It is our hope to have the design portion of the project completed within the next few months with construction to start as funding permits.

Starting with the construction of a new walkway to ease the access from the parking lot on the southwest corner of the church across the front of our church to the landing at the entrance to the vestibule. The proposed walkway will be +/- 9ft in width, with curbing and handrails, and will be capable of accommodating funeral processions as well as ingress and egress for those who are handicapped in addition to the able bodied. The implementation of the walkway will allow for the removal of the existing wooden handicapped access which is sorely in need of replacement.

In addition, to the walkway a retaining wall will be constructed of slump stone masonry at the edge of the current sidewalk on the side which is closest to the church. The wall will be at a height that will enable it to be used for seating as well.

Our existing “Holy Family Parish & School Sign” at the front of our campus along Pearl Avenue has served its purpose for many years and it has deteriorated to the point where it is in desperate need of replacement. We are proposing to replace the sign with a new one that has both interior lighting for nighttime visibility as well as programmable LED display that will highlight upcoming events of interest. We are in the final stages of receiving approval for the new sign from the City of San Jose and hope to have it installed this Fall.

Fr. Andrew has also asked our Committee to replace the cross that at one time was positioned above the vestibule. The architectural team is currently in the process of generating plans for our selection of sizing and materials and, after review of a structural engineer, will be delivering viable suggestions as well as preliminary plans.

During the coming weeks we plan to have our parking lot re-sealed along with fresh striping. Prior to the re-sealing, all of the “speed bumps” will be removed and replaced with appropriately placed “speed humps.”

We announce these projects to advise you of the changes that are coming and to solicit your financial support which is drastically need. Please give generously as we are trying to enhance and beautify the home of our Lord and Savior.

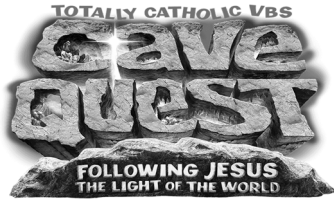

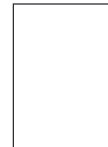

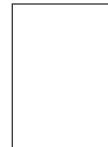
