Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

How does Jesus begin his entrance into the city of his death? He's been journeying toward Jerusalem for the last ten chapters of Luke's gospel. This journey must have taken several weeks. Or was it years? Or was it his entire lifetime? Or did the journey begin with the creation of the world, and culminate on Calvary, and find its fullest meaning very close to Golgotha, in a new tomb that would only be inhabited for a moment?

Having made the journey for which he was born, for which he came into the world, Jesus stood outside the city and gave two disciples directions to a colt—a peacetime animal—and instructed them to just untie it and bring it to him for his entrance into Jerusalem.

Imagine that. The owner of the tethered colt sees two people untying and leading it away. He asks, "Why are you taking my property?" They answer, as if this solves everything, "The Master has need of it." And that's that. The creature that will carry Jesus into the city that will murder him goes off with the disciples. The owner, apparently, understands perfectly. We can imagine him kneeling as he gives his colt to those in service of the Master.

In our lives, death and suffering, resurrection and life are always hovering. Jesus is always making his way to us, giving instructions of where to find what we "own" so that it can be given to him in order to bring life out of our deaths.

The warmth and rock-hard faith you've been withholding, because others might see who you really are? You'll need to give all that up. The Master has need of it.

In what ways is your life a heart-felt Hosanna?

Domingo de Ramos de La Pasión de Nuestro Señor

¿Cómo comienza Jesús su entrada a la ciudad de la muerte? Ha estado en camino hacia Jerusalén por los últimos diez capítulos del evangelio de Lucas. Esta jornada debe haberle tomado varias semanas. ¿O tal vez años? ¿O tal vez toda su vida? ¿O comenzó esta Jornada con la creación del mundo, y culminó en el Calvario, y encontró su pleno significado muy cerca de Gólgota, en una tumba nueva que sería usada solo por un momento?

Habiendo hecho la jornada para la cual nació, por la cual vino al mundo, Jesús se detuvo a las afueras de la ciudad y les dio instrucciones a dos de sus discípulos de ir por un burrito—un animalito de paz—y les dijo que lo desataran y se lo trajeran para hacer su entrada en Jerusalén.

Imagínate eso. El dueño del burrito atado ve a dos personas desatándolo, y llevándoselo. Les pregunta, “¿Por qué se llevan mi propiedad?” Le contestan, como si esto resolviera todo, “El Maestro lo necesita.” Y ya. La criatura que cargará a Jesús para que entre en la ciudad que lo asesinará se va con los discípulos. Tal parece que el dueño comprende perfectamente. Podemos imaginárnoslo de rodillas mientras que les entrega su burrito a estos dos servidores del Maestro.

En nuestras vidas, la muerte y el sufrimiento, la resurrección y la vida siempre andan rondándonos. Jesús siempre viene de camino hacia nosotros, dándonos instrucciones de donde encontrar lo que es “nuestro” para poderse lo entregar a él y así extraer vida de entre nuestras muertes.

¿Esa calidez y esa fe fuerte como una roca que has estado escondiendo para que otros no vean quien realmente eres? Tendrás que hacer entrega de todo eso. El Maestro lo necesita.

¿En qué formas es tu vida un Hosanna que viene desde lo más profundo de tu corazón?
